2022 Pledge Drive Begins

We want to personally thank you for your generosity and commitment to the life, mission and ministry of our congregation. With all that has happened with COVID, 2021 has been a truly blessed year!

Due to your support, we have been able to reach out with the love of Christ not only to the homeless and hungry in our area through our CROP Walk and area social ministries, we were able as well to extend our love to the children of the world including children of Dorogobuzh, Russia, through the Bible Camp ministry of our sister congregation.

Due to your support, we have been able to support our witness and worship of our Lord and Savior Jesus by offering to our community each Sunday a joyful fellowship and meaningful worship that welcomes all with the love and grace of Jesus Christ.

In other words, due to your commitment to our Lord, lives have been changed in His name.

Pledge forms and a copy of the proposed budget for 2022 were mailed to everyone the third week in October. If you didn't receive yours, please see Leslie Lintz, Carolyn Thomas or Chris Schleter and they will see that you get yours.

Giving is our faith response to God's gifts. God wants us to give willingly and cheerfully out of hearts filled with love and gratitude for our present and eternal lives. We also give out of obedience because God's Word directs us to give.

Our budget is about \$12,570 higher than last year due to prices going up due to inflation, an unknown increase in our insurance premiums (we've been told to expect about a 20% to 25% increase), contracting for a landscaping service to maintain our grounds and salary increases for Rev. Ralph, Steve Talley and our secretaries. We've seen our loose offerings drop by nearly \$10,000 this year so we're asking for about \$22,570 more in pledges for 2022 to cover our expenditures.

Every pledge, no matter how big or small, puts us closer to our goal. You can make a pledge by dropping your pledge form in the offering plate on any Sunday or by returning it to the church office.

You can also pledge online by going to our website, hovering over Stewardship in the menu and clicking Pledge Support. On the Pledge Support page, click on General Fund Pledge on the right then fill out and submit the form. Our Financial Secretary, LaVerna Metzger, will receive an email with your pledge.

If you have any questions, please speak with Leslie Lintz, Carolyn Thomas or Chris Schleter, your Stewardship Committee.

We will dedicate our pledges during worship on December 19th.



Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (NASB)



In a sermon at Immanuel Presbyterian Church in Los Angeles, Gary Wilburn said: "In 1636, amid the darkness of the Thirty Years' War, a German pastor, Martin Rinkart, is said to have buried five thousand of his parishioners in one year, an average of fifteen a day. His parish was ravaged by war, death, and economic disaster. In the heart of that darkness, with the cries of fear outside his window, he sat down and wrote this table grace for his children:

*"Now thank we all our God
With heart and hands and voices;
Who wondrous things had done
In whom His world rejoices.
Who, from our mother's arms
Hath led us on our way
With countless gifts of love
And still is ours today."*

Without question my favorite Thanksgiving hymn is "Now Thank We All Our God", #643 in our Presbyterian Hymnal. Not only is it my favorite because of the beautiful simplicity of faith expressed in thanks to God, but, as well, the faith of its author in the God of our lives and times.

Thanksgiving, our national holiday, was set aside as a time to look back upon the blessings we have received from our bounteous Lord and God and to give thanks for the year behind, looking forward to the year ahead.

One could look back upon the past couple of years and give thanks these years are behind us and withhold our thanks depending on what lies ahead.

However, there is no comparison between what Pastor Rinkart and his congregation and city experienced to what we have endured, not even close!

Yet in our possible cynicism we need to understand that Pastor Rinkart found faith and thanksgiving. More likely, rather, Pastor Rinkart did not find his faith but instead leaned wholly upon it; which led him to the end of those dark days to give thanks and praise to the living God who *"Hath led us on our way with countless gifts of love, and still is ours today."*

May we, as we enter our season of Thanksgiving, seek to be as faithful...and thankful.

This year has been a roller coaster ride for my emotions and faith in all things God can do for me. I had noticed years before that my husband was having a great deal of trouble remembering words and places. Not surprising for someone in his mid-seventies. But his memory issues were getting much worse. I was aware of Memory Matters, a local organization helping caregivers and those with memory loss. I received an immediate response when I requested their recommendation for the best doctor to diagnose his condition. Being in the doctor's waiting room

and noticing the cross on the wall and the prayer request box on the shelf, I knew that God had provided that first answer to prayer in this Christian doctor.

With his "dementia" diagnosis, I prayed for guidance and support as we faced our journey ahead. I shared my husband's condition with a water aerobics friend who surprised me with an admission that her husband had died earlier in the year from dementia and gave me assurance that I could depend on her for support and understanding. Another source of comfort comes from my memories of my mother, suffering from diabetes and Parkinson's Disease, assuring me that God does not give me more challenges than what I can handle with His constant love.

Through sharing my husband's diagnosis with my church family at Good Shepherd, God has provided comfort from those who have experienced this same journey. He has blessed me with constant support and knowledge that I am not alone. Never before in my faith journey have I received such affirmation that my trust in God and His goodness will be with me in our years ahead.

Everyone is welcome and we'll have everything needed to pack 60 (or more) shoeboxes.

We'll dedicate our shoeboxes on November 21st and deliver them to the collection point on November 22nd.

SAVE THE DATE: CPR for the NON-PROFESSIONAL class - Wednesday, November 17th at 9:00 am and continuing until 11:00 or 11:30 am in Conklin Hall. COVID-19 precautions will be followed. The cost is \$25 payable to the instructor, Rob Hooper, on the morning of the class. Rob previously has been our instructor and accepts cash, check or credit card. Plus - donuts will be served!

Whether you need re-certification (due every two years) or have never taken such a class before, please join us. Rob also reviews use of the AED (Automated External Defibrillator) device - available as part of our Church's emergency equipment. There is no advance study required for attending the class and it's a non-threatening way for you to gain knowledge and the ability to possibly save a life in an emergency situation. IT'S FLU VACCINE TIME. If you haven't yet received your Flu vaccine this year, it's not too late to do so. The maximum immunity lasts 4-5 months and, optimally, should be timed to most effectively cover the typical February-March prevalence of cases of flu in our area. As we have read, medical professionals feel it will be especially important to have a Flu shot this year because of the additional prevalence of COVID-19 virus. Neither the COVID or Flu vaccines claim to be 100% effective, but, having had them can lessen the severity of illness should you contract either or both viruses. You may receive more than one of the vaccines at the same time.

You also might want to consider checking with your medical provider about whether you are up-to-date with other important vaccinations -

- Shingles Vaccine - starting at age 50 - two doses
- Pneumonia Vaccine - one dose
- COVID-19 Vaccine - two doses
- COVID Vaccine Booster - six months after second of two initial shots

Moderna boosters are available, according to CDC directives, through the SW Utah Department of Health and you can get a Moderna booster regardless of the type of your initial vaccination. At this time the Health Department is administering COVID vaccines by appointment only. For information or to register, contact them at 435-986-2591 or swuhealth.org/COVID-vaccine/ or swuhealth.org/booster/

Congregational Growth & Care, continued

With the exception of shingles, flu, COVID and pneumococcal diseases are spread by droplets and may exhibit similar symptoms. It's important to be proactive in protecting yourself and others. Continue wearing masks in crowded areas, distance, wash or sanitize your hands frequently and stay home if you feel sick. If you do become ill and have ANY question about the cause of your infection, see your medical provider and - GET TESTED for the possibility it could be COVID - whether or not you have been vaccinated.
