

Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

In the same region there were some shepherds staying out in the fields and keeping watch over their flock at night. And an angel of the Lord suddenly stood near them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them; and they were terribly frightened. And so the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people; for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there appeared with the angel a multitude of the heavenly army of angels praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace among people with whom He is pleased."

Luke 2:8-14 NASB



The Gospel of Luke's account of the Nativity offers a dramatic scene during a traumatic time. In the dark of night suddenly the light of hope breaks upon a world during dark times bringing the message of hope: "Do not fear, for 'good news of great joy which will be for all people."

Like those shepherds, we find ourselves living in the midst of a dark night during traumatic times. And like those shepherds we, as well, have received good news of great joy of a coming vaccine, of a brighter and new day for all people.

Christmas itself a season of joy that comes from the hope we see in the face of this newborn child we know as Christ the Lord. But Hope can be a funny thing. We can put it on a shelf and use it as needed or take hope into our hearts and lives and live as people who are lost and found in this Hope.

Mission/Outreach

On November 6th, nine of us (yes, we stayed under the COVID-19 limit of 10 people and wore our masks) gathered in a socially distanced Conklin Hall to pack shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. We had a great time and packed 81 shoe boxes. Adding in the 25 boxes packed by individuals in the congregation we delivered a total of 106 boxes to our drop off location on November 21st. Thanks to all who participated this year. If you want to get an early start on 2021, we have some empty boxes left over!

Rev. Ralph received an email from Pastor Sergei at the end of October with photos of the church's progress of adding an indoor toilet to the church building. Sergei said that they were well into the project but they had a problem: they didn't have enough money to purchase the actual toilet! He asked if we could help them with purchasing both the toilet and Christmas presents for the children. Knowing how much Gloria McGilloway enjoyed the outhouse in 2018, Rev. Ralph and I were a bit hesitant to do anything that might take that blessing away from her but after prayerful deliberation decided that we would send some money. Session approved the expenditure of \$750 from the Mission

Parish Health Ministry

THIS WAS THE YEAR THAT WAS ... almost. Our faith and endurance have been challenged beyond all boundaries in these past months and yet, we are here, by the grace of God and the skill and knowledge that has been endowed to our medical community and then to us. We have learned so much about the virus among us! While we have been focused on all things COVID, a tireless and dedicated group of scientists and medical explorers have continued looking for ways of providing a better quality of life for those afflicted with certain non-CVOID-related diseases.

In a recent issue of <u>AARP The Magazine</u>, an article discussed the medical breakthroughs for 2020 which might influence the course of many known diseases. It is possible for diabetics to have transplants of islet-cells from cadavers to replace their own non-functioning, insulin-producing cells. There are new therapies targeted especially for the care of those with HER2 breast cancer and prostate cancer patients have found new hope in discoveries which demonstrate disease progression may be influenced by suppressing the production of hormones or preventing their effect on cells. Stem cell-based renal implants slow progression or can even improve vision in those with age-related macular degeneration. Ablation of damaged heart tissue with radiation is being investigated and may replace the more traditional, longer and more invasive current procedures employed for restoring normal heart rhythm. And relief may be available for those with COPD or emphysema by way of implantation of a tiny valve into the lungs to boost breathing.

It is difficult not to become mired in the uncertain present, as in the in the film, "Groundhog Day," when each day was like the one before. However, God has promised to make all things NEW. Restored physical and mental well-being can to be had by trusting in His promises. We of Parish Health Ministries wish you a blessed holiday season and healthy, hopeful, NEW YEAR!!

I had time to appreciate the beautiful Iowa landscape and watch as the corn went from tiny seedlings to harvested gold. One afternoon, as I was enjoying the sunset, I felt an indescribable sense of peace and well-being sweep over me. It was so intense I had to pull over and stop. Tears welled in my eyes as the happiness and contentment enfolded me. The intensity ebbed after a short time, although the joyous feeling remained, and I was able to drive again.

I remember that day when things are uncertain, or I am weary. The day I felt God tell me, "Yes, Child, I will take care of you." The tears of joy return; and I am grateful.

Session News

Session held their monthly meeting on November 8, 2020. Here is a synopsis of the actions taken in November:

- Adopted a resolution modifying the allocation to the pastor's 2020 Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan to \$4,350, moving \$350 from his annual expense allowance to the Health Reimbursement allowance.
- Approved to place 10% (\$1,000) from a beguest into the Mission Set Aside Fund.
- Approved to terminate employment of one church secretary effective December 31, 2020.
- Approved the expenditure of \$750 from Russia Mission Fund as a donation to Pastor Sergei and his church for Christmas gifts for the orphanage and fixtures for the new bathroom in the church building.
- Approved the expenditure of \$1,000 from Mission Set Aside Fund to provide postage and final items for Operation Christmas Child boxes for this year.
- Scheduled the Stated Congregational Meeting on Sunday, December 13, 2020, at 11:30 am via Zoom to consider the 2021 Terms of Call of the Pastor and any other actions that may be necessary.
- Discussed reopening of Worship and other Church activities with agreement to proceed with caution and consideration of the recommendations of the State of Utah, Presbytery, and Local Health Departments. Due to increased number of cases of COVID-19 in Southwest Utah, Session agreed to continue with the current virtual Worship Services, Zoom Bible Studies and Zoom Fellowship Hour and Zoom Christian Education Classes for both adults and children.

Next meeting of the Session will be Sunday, December 13, 2020, at 12:30 pm via Zoom.

The Church continues to do fairly well financially considering our current circumstances. Our total revenue is way below budget but, because we are not spending as much money, we still have not had to tap into our reserves. With the coming of the new year, however, that may change. Stewardship, continued

The Treasurer's report for October appears on page 2, and our Building Fund report is on page 11.

As I reported last month, we do have a major challenge on the horizon. In formulating the budget, we first evaluate and define our expected expenditures. Next, based on the current year and historical data, we estimate how much we can expect to receive in loose offerings. The difference is what we need in pledges to fund the operation and missions of the church. For 2021 we need \$144,862 in pledges to fully fund the budget. As of Sunday, November 22nd, we have pledges totaling just \$61,504 or 42 percent of the amount we need. If you are able to pledge we request that you make your pledge as soon as you can. You can pledge by filling out your pledge form and returning it to the church to the attention of the Financial Secretary. You can also pledge at our website, gspcsg.org (go to Stewardship then Pledge Support and click on General Fund Pledge on the right). You can also email your pledge to our Financial Secretary, LaVerna Metzger, at finsec@gspcsg.org. Without knowing how much pledge income we can expect it is difficult to determine how much we can safely spend. We will dedicate our pledges during worship on December 13th.

Building Fund Update

When we took out our mortgage, we estimated that we needed \$384,000 in order to pay off the mortgage and have the resources to meet our needs for maintaining and improving our facilities. Now that our mortgage has been retired, we have turned our attention to several major maintenance items and improvements that need to be addressed over the next several years. These projects, totaling more than \$145,000, need to be funded. We still need your help.

Through November 22nd we have received pledges towards our third campaign totaling **\$56,100** and additional cash donations of **\$37,530** giving us a total for all three campaigns of **\$288,693** or about **75.0%** of our **\$384,000** goal.

Thanks to everyone who has made a pledge to the third campaign. If you haven't pledged, please prayerfully consider making a pledge to help us ensure that our facilities remain in top notch condition and to allow us to make some needed improvements.
