Palm Sunday Worship was LIVE

As you no doubt know, we resumed live worship on Palm Sunday, March 28th. While we were in the parking lot instead of in the Sanctuary, at least we were together as we commemorated the entry of our Lord into Jerusalem.

Even though it was a bit chilly at the start of the service, it was a beautiful sunny day and we had 81 people in the west parking lot (and 3 more on Zoom) who attended and were infused with the Holy Spirit as we worshiped, heard Scriptures and sang hymns together. We were treated to a Prelude with Steve Talley playing the organ and Dr. Ka-Wai Yu playing his cello and an anthem, again with Steve Talley, playing the piano this time, accompanying Ka-Wai singing. Because of the way in which we were able to provide sound for those in the parking lot while still providing a usable stream on Zoom, both Steve and Ka-Wai were in the Sanctuary. We look forward to getting everyone back inside where we can all be together and see everything.

Special thanks go to our ushers, Russ and Candy Hurlbut and Eric and Vicky Westland. Because this was the first time we have tried doing an outdoor service, having to maintain social distancing and not knowing exactly what to expect, they did a great job of keeping everything organized. All of them looked really good in their orange safety vests. Who knows, when we move back inside we may keep the vests for the ushers to wear so everyone knows who they are.

We will continue with outdoor worship for the next few weeks until as many of our church family as possible have been fully vaccinated and it is safe to move back into the Sanctuary.

We hope you will continue to join us in the parking lot on Sundays but if you can't be with us in person or don't feel comfortable gathering for worship you can still watch the service on Zoom. Just email Rev. Ralph and he will send you an invitation. For those joining via Zoom, the bulletin, hymn lyrics and weekly calendar are available from our Sermon Network page, gspcsg.sermon.net, by Saturday each week. And, as always, the recorded service will be available on the Listen to Services page on our website, gspcsg.org, or our Sermon Network page, gspcsg.sermon.net, by around Noon each Sunday.



It was magnificent, and the two stayed for about 15 minutes!

I believe that God answered my prayers for reassurance that two people I loved are together. I'll see them again.

With indoor worship hopefully around the corner, we are working on taking the main building out of mothballs. The building has really not presented any big issues during the last year, for which we can be grateful.

I am going to flush all of the water lines as recommended by the CDC and then take water samples in for testing at the county health department. There is a remote chance that the building inactivity may have led to some bacterial growth in the water system and up until now, I've been using Ralph as our test vehicle, but I want to be sure.

Those that sit in the back row of the choir may be interested in knowing that I am in the process of replacing the small wood strip across the back of the risers that prevents a chair leg from falling off the back of the riser. Well, most of the time it prevents that. We had two choir members almost go off the back side when sitting down (The sopranos were suspect). Fortunately, people sitting next to them caught them before a serious injury. The new guard will be 2-1/2" taller and since most of the basses and tenors can't lift a chair higher than 2" anymore, we should be good to go.

Building Fund Update

When we took out our mortgage, we estimated that we needed \$384,000 in order to pay off the mortgage and have the resources to meet our needs for maintaining and improving our facilities. Now that our mortgage has been retired, we have turned our attention to several major maintenance items and improvements that need to be addressed over the next several years. These projects, totaling more than \$145,000, need to be funded. We still need your help.

Through March 21st we have received pledges towards our third campaign totaling **\$56,100** and additional cash donations of **\$47,430** giving us a total for all three campaigns of **\$298,593** or about **77.7%** of our **\$384,000** goal.
