

Buildings

The Memorial Garden at Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church was built in 1993 shortly after initial construction of the Church, itself. It consists of two rose gardens, interconnecting walkways within a grassed and treed area, and a memorial gazebo with window boxes recording those individuals who have been interred. Currently, the garden serves as the final resting place for approximately 100 former members, family and friends of our congregation.

The garden is maintained by the Grounds Committee, with assistance from the Building Committee, as required. Current estimates are that the capacity of the Memorial Garden will be reached in 2 to 4 years.

During the December meeting of Session, Building and Grounds proposed formation of a committee to explore options for expansion and upgrading of the Memorial Garden with the objective of serving the needs of the congregation for the next 20-30 years. Session approved the proposal. I, as a member of the Building Committee have volunteered to lead the effort, which will be under the direction of Grounds Elder Alan Paige. We need additional volunteers who represent a cross-section of our ministries to serve on the committee. The Memorial Garden committee is responsible for making a recommendation to Session which will include specific proposed upgrades, a rough order-of-magnitude cost estimate, and a suggested funding strategy for the project.

Mission/Outreach

The final report on the CROP walk is in and, once again, our community came together in a big way to help to eliminate hunger in our area and around the world. The walk raised a total of \$4,700 this year and 25% of the total stayed in our area through a donation to Solomon's Porch Foursquare Fellowship. Once again Good Shepherd led the way with \$840 in donations.

We have been tracking our Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes and 12 of the 20 boxes we are tracking (the boxes that included soccer balls) have been shipped to their final destinations. Ten of the boxes are on their way to the Pacific Islands and the other two are headed for the Philippines. The other eight are in the distribution center in Southern California awaiting shipment. We'll keep checking and let you know where the last eight boxes end up.

As is our custom, we made our year-end donations to local charities the week after Christmas. With the pandemic affecting so many in our community our donations were especially needed this year. Also, their activities have been curtailed by COVID, the Women's Guild was only able to raise money for two of their donations, so we added their other two charities to Mission's traditional recipients to be sure no charity was left out. We also continued our donation to The Salvation Army, which we made in honor of our late Visitation Pastor, Dick Higgins, and to the Utah Food Bank. Here is the list of our recipients for 2021:

Session News

Session held their monthly meeting on December 12th. Here is a synopsis of the action that was taken:

- Approved a resolution for a credit card for Mary Contreras, Elder for Fellowship, with a \$500 credit limit.
- Approved the formation of a committee under Grounds Elder Alen Paige to study the feasibility of Memorial Garden improvements.
- Approved year-end donations utilizing remaining Local Mission funds and a portion of the Mission Set Aside Fund.
- Approved the purchase of a dbx DriveRack 260 Loudspeaker Management System and dbx RTA-M reference Microphone not to exceed \$1,000 to be funded from bequests.
- At a December 12, 2021m Stated Congregational Meeting, the congregation accepted the report from the Nominating Committee electing elders, deacons and the 2022 Nominating Committee, was presented with the 2022 Annual Budget, and accepted the Terms of Call of the Pastor for 2022. Installation of officers will take place on Sunday, January 9, 2022, during the worship service.

The next meeting of the Session will be Sunday, January 9, 2021, at 12:00 Noon in the CE Building.

Soup Kitchen

Our church has had a long and active commitment to the Switchpoint Soup Kitchen. As one of our primary focuses of our Mission work, many have cooked and supervised the kitchen. In the St George area, the Soup Kitchen began as part of the Catholic Church's outreach to the hungry. Since their facility didn't quite fit the needs for serving hungry folks, the Soup Kitchen moved to the Grace Episcopal Church which has a cozy kitchen and large dining room. With this move in 2010 our cooks and servers moved right along with the Soup.

Gloria Reynolds took the lead from the very beginning of the Soup Kitchen as Good Shepherd's kitchen supervisor. She prepared nutritious, healthy recipes that could feed 100+ hungry people each time our team participated. As Liz Larsen reports, Gloria would set the menu and then each cook would bring ingredients to prepare the meal. Donna Beasley took the lead one day when Gloria couldn't attend and she came up with a wonderful coleslaw recipe that complemented the rest of the meal. Ever since that day, coleslaw has been on our menu and is now known as "Presbyterian Coleslaw."

So many women and men in our congregation have taken a turn at cooking at the Soup Kitchen. While we don't have a complete roster from the beginning of our involvement, a few names should be listed. Josie Kellejan was active from the very beginning with Gloria. Josie grew up in France during times that included World War II. She has such fond memories of the GI's sharing their rations with her family and has worked to feed the hungry in St George as

a way of giving back to the country that fed her when she was hungry. Paul Reynolds worked with Gloria's crew along with Carl Beasley. Marge Linn, Rayanne Bartlett, Larry Gearhart, Sue & Mark Licher, Ruth Ann Horvath, Janis Wick, and Brian & Patti Lusby spent many first Mondays of the month preparing meals. Others who have joined in are Vicky Westland, LaVerna Metzger, Eliza Elwood, Candy Hurlbut, Carol Somplatsky-Jarman, Mary Laubscher, Nancy Higgins, Sue Lundgreen, Steve & Susan Talley, Alan Dull and Ruthanne Skinner.

While our support of the Soup Kitchen remains very strong with so many wonderful donations of food, supplies, and money, our ability to cook in the Kitchen has come to an end. When Covid-19 hit our community, the Switchpoint organization made a much-needed change to their method of serving the hungry. Unable to serve within the Episcopal Church dining room for the safety of those who came to eat, it was decided to provide to-go meals only. With the heat of summer, the Soup Kitchen was moved to the Switchpoint facility where a large, covered patio was available for those being served to get out of the heat while enjoying their meal. Our cooking in the Soup Kitchen continued at the Switchpoint Cafeteria through December, 2021 but, this activity simply has become too much of a burden for us.

Our Mission support of the Soup Kitchen will remain very strong. Each month we will continue our donations of food, supplies and financial support. Each one of us can help to feed the hungry in St George with our Soup Kitchen support during the first Sunday of each month.

Building Fund Update

When we took out our mortgage, we estimated that we needed \$384,000 to pay off the mortgage and have the resources to meet our needs for maintaining and improving our facilities. Now that our mortgage has been retired, we have turned our attention to several major maintenance items and improvements that need to be addressed over the next several years. These projects, totaling more than \$145,000, need to be funded. We still need your help.

Through December 19th we have received pledges towards our third campaign totaling **\$56,100** and additional cash donations of **\$54,725** giving us a total for all three campaigns of **\$305,888** or about **79.6** of our **\$384,000** goal.

While we are not currently conducting a Building Fund campaign, we do need donations to the Building Fund to ensure that our buildings and grounds are kept in good condition. Please consider a donation to the Building Fund to help us reach our goal.
