Lent and Easter Are Coming to Good Shepherd

The season of Lent and our celebration of Easter are always busy times at Good Shepherd and 2022 will be no exception.

We will celebrate the Good Shepherd version of Mardi Gras on Shrove Tuesday, March 1^{st} , but instead of a Shrove Tuesday Breakfast this year's celebration will be a pancake DINNER. Join us from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm in Conklin Hall.

Our observation of Lent begins on March 2nd with our annual Ash Wednesday Services at 11:00 am and 7:00 pm in the Sanctuary.

As he did last year, Rev. Ralph will be leading a Bible Study on Monday evenings during Lent. The series, which kicked off on February 21st, meets in the CE Building at 6:00 pm and will continue every Monday through April 11th. The topic this year is the Gospel of Mark.

On April 10th, Palm Sunday, Rev. Ralph and his team of men will serve us a hearty breakfast beginning at 8:30 am in Conklin Hall. This event is always well attended and we appreciate the efforts of all who provide food for us. Our service on Palm Sunday will be filled with music by our choirs.

On Maundy Thursday, April 14th, we will hold an Agape Dinner beginning at 6:00 pm in Conklin Hall. The lighting of oil lamps adds to the significance of this service.

The following day, Good Friday, will kick off at 10:00 am with the annual Procession of the Cross and close with an Ecumenical Service at 7:00 pm at Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church.

We will not have an early service or adult education on Easter Sunday, April 17th, so we can all prepare ourselves to celebrate our Risen Lord. After the service, we hope you will join us for Easter Brunch in Conklin Hall.

We hope you can attend as many of these events as your schedule permits.

Services Live Streamed Every Sunday

Let's say it's Sunday morning and you just can't make it to church. What can you do? You can join us through the live stream we provide both at our website (<u>http://gspcsg.org</u>) and our Sermon Network site (<u>https://gspcsg.sermon.net/</u>). The stream begins about 10:28 am each Sunday and concludes at the end of the Postlude. With Jeff Clingan producing, you'll be able to watch the entire service and a bulletin including hymn lyrics and the calendar for the week is available for download.

The video will be available until Sunday evening if you prefer to watch later in the day and the audio will be available for at least a couple of months. Please be aware that we do not publish the service - this is handled by Sermon Net - and it generally takes about 30 minutes after the service before it is published, so please be patient.

We look forward to seeing everyone in church but if you just can't make it, we hope you will find the live stream useful and fulfilling.



Treasurer's Report



Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

"Lent" comes from the old English word for springtime, perhaps connected with the lengthening of days in this time of the year in the Northern Hemisphere. The season of Lent is a time for growth in faith---through prayer, spiritual discipline, and self-examination in preparation for the commemoration of the dying and rising of the Lord Jesus Christ. In ancient Christian practice, Lent was a time pf preparation for the celebration of Baptism as Easter. In many churches it remains a time to equip and nurture candidates for Baptism or confirmation, and for the whole community of faith to reflect deeply on the theme of baptismal discipleship. Reconciliation is a key theme in the season of Lent—reconciliation with God and with one another through the Grace of Jesus Christ.

Lent is a period of forty days—like the flood of Genesis, Moses sojourn at Sinai, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah's call to Nineveh, and Jesus' testing in the wilderness. The Sundays in Lent are not counted among the forty days, as every Lord's Day is a celebration of Christ's resurrection. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and concludes at sunset on Holy Saturday, at the start of the Great Vigil of Easter."

Lent begins officially following our Shrove Tuesday Dinner, on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022. A time to acknowledge our sin and failing and begin a spiritual journey that leads us to the great celebration of Resurrection Sunday.

Historically this church season, Lent, is a time to fast and self-sacrifice. I like to see it as a time of opportunity. The opportunity to grow in our Christian faith, commitment, and discipleship. To use the various tools available to help us accomplish to our benefit this sacred time. Such as Bible study, we have a number available to choose from. Volunteer to serve on one of our several committees in the area that may interest you. Increase your prayer time or find a daily devotional to journey through the season. Seek ways and times to join in the fellowship and love of our Christian community.

Primarily and most importantly recognizing that each day is a gift, especially in Lent, I invite you and encourage you join me on this Lenten journey, receive this gift, and with the Resurrection dawn, return this gift to the Lord, our Risen Lord, our lives and selves.

Late, Late, Late Shrove Tuesday Breakfast

The church season of Lent begins with the observance of Ash Wednesday which this year falls on March 2nd. However, going back to the earliest days of Christianity and church seasons, Shrove Tuesday, the day that precedes Ash Wednesday, has been observed as a day to indulge in food, particularly pancakes and the usual accompaniments. Our tradition has been to observe with a breakfast; however, it is far more common for the timing of this pre-Lent meal to be during the supper hour. Therefore, this year we are moving our Shrove Tuesday Breakfast, March 1st, from the early morning to the dinner hour 5:30-7:00 pm. The dinner will conclude with a brief evening worship in Conklin Hall thus preparing us for the season of Lent. In other words, our Shrove Tuesday Breakfast is becoming our Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner. Session News

Session held their monthly meeting on February 13th. Here is a synopsis of the action that was taken:

- Approved an E-Vote of January 24, 2022, to purchase a laptop for the church treasurer at a cost not to exceed \$1,500.
- Approved April 28- May 7, 2022, vacation for Rev. Ralph Clingan.
- Approved the expenditure of \$609 for 2022 Lenten Study curriculum.
- Adopted Expense Reporting Policy #PO-5-002 regarding reimbursable expense policy and procedures.
- Authorized Mary Laubscher, Treasurer, to transfer funds between all State Bank of Southern Utah checking and money market accounts. These accounts include but are not limited to: General Fund, Memorial Fund, Building Fund, Russia Mission Fund and Capital Reserve Fund. In addition, Mary Laubscher is authorized to transfer funds from the General Fund, Memorial Fund, Building Fund, Russia Mission Fund and Capital Reserve Fund to pay State Bank of Southern Utah credit card bills as they become due.
- Adopted a Resolution authorizing the State Bank of Southern Utah to issue a credit card to Mary Laubscher with a credit limit of \$500.
- Voted to delay the appointment of Mary Laubscher as Treasurer until it is necessary to do so.

How to Join Zoom at Noon

Joining a Zoom meeting is easy. You can join with video from your webcam or with audio only. You also can use either a computer or your phone or tablet.

To join the meeting, open your browser and enter <u>zoom.us</u> in the address bar. When the Zoom page opens, click on Join a Meeting at the top and, when the join meeting page opens, enter the Meeting ID (822 4060 7546) in the box at the center of the screen, enter and wait to be admitted to the program.

Everyone's microphone should be muted when they enter the meeting. Please check when you enter the meeting. If there is a red diagonal line across the microphone symbol in the bottom left corner of the screen and the caption reads "Unmute" your microphone is muted. If there is no red line and the caption reads "Mute" please click on that symbol to mute the microphone.

To ask a question please unmute your mic by clicking on the microphone symbol and when you are done click on the symbol again to mute it again. Please wait until the speaker asks for questions to do this.

If you want to share video from your camera, click the camera symbol to the right of the microphone symbol (the caption should read "Start Video") to start sharing your camera. There is no need for you to share your camera unless you wish to do so.

You're ready so just sit back and enjoy the program.

When the program ends or if you wish to leave the Zoom session, click on the red Leave Meeting button at the bottom right of the screen. You can rejoin the meeting later if you wish by going back to the Zoom page and following the instructions in the second paragraph above.

Building Fund Update

When we took out our mortgage, we estimated that we needed \$384,000 to pay off the mortgage and have the resources to meet our needs for maintaining and improving our facilities. Now that our mortgage has been retired, we have turned our attention to several major maintenance items and improvements that need to be addressed over the next several years. These projects, totaling more than \$145,000, need to be funded. We still need your help.

Through January 23rd we have received pledges towards our third campaign totaling **\$56,100** and additional cash donations of **\$56,300** giving us a total for all three campaigns of **\$307,463** or about **80.1** of our **\$384,000** goal.

While we are not currently conducting a Building Fund campaign, we do need donations to the Building Fund to ensure that our buildings and grounds are kept in good condition. Please consider a donation to the Building Fund to help us reach our goal.
