Lent and Easter In Full Swing At Good Shepherd

It's been a busy Lenten season in 2022, beginning with the Shrove Tuesday Dinner. As we move closer to the Resurrection of our Lord on April 17th, Easter Sunday, we look forward to several upcoming events.

On April 10th, Palm Sunday, Rev. Ralph and his team of men will serve us a hearty breakfast beginning at 8:30 am in Conklin Hall. This event is always well attended, and we appreciate the efforts of all who provide food for us. Our service on Palm Sunday will be filled with music by our choirs.

Rev. Ralph will wrap up his Lenten Bible Study series on Monday, April 11th at 6:00 pm in the CE Building. The topic this year is the Gospel of Mark.

On Maundy Thursday, April 14th, we will hold an Agape Dinner beginning at 6:00 pm in Conklin Hall. The lighting of oil lamps adds to the significance of this service.

The following day, Good Friday, will kick off at 10:00 am with the annual Procession of the Cross beginning at Diagonal Park and close with an Ecumenical Service at 7:00 pm at Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church.

We will not have an early service or adult education on Easter Sunday, April 17th, so we can all prepare ourselves to celebrate our Risen Lord. After the service, we hope you will join us for Easter Brunch in Conklin Hall.

We hope you can attend as many of these events as your schedule permits.

Services Live Streamed Every Sunday

Let's say it's Sunday morning and you just can't make it to church. What can you do? You can join us through the live stream we provide both at our website (http://gspcsg.org) and our Sermon Network site (https://gspcsg.sermon.net/). The stream begins about 10:29 am each Sunday and concludes at the end of the Postlude. With Jeff Clingan producing, you'll be able to watch the entire service and a bulletin including hymn lyrics and the calendar for the week is available for download.

The video will be available until Sunday evening if you prefer to watch later in the day and the audio will be available for at least a couple of months. Please be aware that we do not publish the service - this is handled by Sermon Net - and it generally takes about 30 minutes after the service before it is available, so please be patient.

We look forward to seeing everyone in church but if you just can't make it, we hope you will find the live stream useful and fulfilling.



Emanuel – God With Us

St. George has been my home for almost four years, and my second retirement home. My husband Leonard and I moved here from the Oregon coast, where we had lived for 14 years. That was a big change, but we were happy because our son lived here.

A few months after our move, Leonard was diagnosed with Stage IV colon cancer. Suddenly our future changed. His chemo began and the schedule was every two weeks, four hours each

time along with a pump that he wore from Monday to Wednesday. He had a very good attitude and he rarely complained, in fact he played golf on his off week. We knew that the treatment was not going to cure him but give him at least two years. I was trying to be brave but could not imagine my life without him. God was there all the time, but I was too involved with taking care of Leonard and not thinking about me. I prayed and didn't feel any great relief. Perhaps I was too concerned for Leonard and not listening for God. The chemo continued for almost one year. Leonard was getting weaker and losing more weight. On a Friday in December 2019, Leonard wanted to play golf, so I drove the golf cart and he played. On Sunday he wasn't feeling very good, and his breathing didn't sound good, so we went to the ER; he had pneumonia in both lungs. All the medications they were giving him were not helping, and he died Tuesday night. It is difficult to describe that moment, to know that someone you've loved for 57 years is gone. I know now that God was with me all those days of treatments as Leonard grew weaker but still smiled at me. The adjustment to being alone is ongoing, however knowing that God is with me every minute of my life makes each day a little easier.

Doors. More accurately, locking doors. I believe we all want easy access to our facilities for our wonderful activities, but we also want to keep the building secure when unoccupied. So, when you are at church during "off-times", please make sure the doors are locked when you leave, just like when at home.

One particularly troublesome door is the glass narthex door. If it is locked and you exit the door without pushing the panic bar hard enough, it will not latch when it closes. I have taken the mechanism apart so many times to make adjustments that I could do it blindfolded. Basically, it is just a weak design that would be expensive to replace. So, while pondering what to do during one of Rev. Ralph's sermons on how some of the choir members in the bass section seemed to have gained weight, I improvised a device that will sound an alarm if the door does not latch. It's not as loud as the tsunami alarm at the Temple, but it will get your attention so we can keep our doors locked and use our funds for better purposes.

We are especially blessed here at Good Shepherd to be able to offer comfort and care through attending our Grief and Loss Support Group, which meets in Conklin Hall each Tuesday at 6:30pm. No pre-registration is necessary. Whether or not to share in the group is a personal decision and discussions are confidential. Building Fund Update

When we took out our mortgage, we estimated that we needed \$384,000 to pay off the mortgage and have the resources to meet our needs for maintaining and improving our facilities. Now that our mortgage has been retired, we have turned our attention to several major maintenance items and improvements that need to be addressed over the next several years. These projects, totaling more than \$145,000, need to be funded. We still need your help.

Through January 23rd we have received pledges towards our third campaign totaling **\$56,100** and additional cash donations of **\$60,595** giving us a total for all three campaigns of **\$311,758** or about **81.2** of our **\$384,000** goal.

While we are not currently conducting a Building Fund campaign, we do need donations to the Building Fund to ensure that our buildings and grounds are kept in good condition. Please consider a donation to the Building Fund to help us reach our goal.
