

# Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

And he sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the Child; and when you have found Him, report to me, so that I too may come and worship Him." After hearing the king, they went on their way; and behold, the star, which they had seen in the east, went on ahead of them until it came to a stop over the place where the Child was to be found. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And after they came into the house, they saw the Child with His mother Mary; and they fell down and worshiped Him. Then they opened their treasures and presented to Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh

There are a multitude of stories surrounding the Christmas story. Some fictional, some Biblical, some cultural, such as the case of the "Little Drummer Boy".

I will always remember one of my first Christmas seasons here in this congregation. After teaching an adult class on how such myths and cultural carryovers cloud our eyes to the Christmas miracle, I cited as a clear example that the story of the "Little Drummer Boy" was absolutely, emphatically, clearly NOT in the Bible! You can imagine my horror as shortly thereafter, walking into our sanctuary, on top of our grand piano sat a statuette of who else but THE LITTLE DRUMMER BOY! He shortly disappeared, never to be seen hence. Another Christmas mystery.

Another example would be the Magi, or Three Kings of the Gospel of Matthew. Popular tradition has given them the names, Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Tradition has given them number, and a much more recent suggestion includes gender. In that they had to be women in that they stopped and asked for directions. However, examining the actual Biblical text from Matthew we know neither number or name. Just that they were from the east, looking for a promised king, following a star, bearing three gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

It is a story of faith. The story of a faith journey, for they had left their comfort zones and lives to search for a savior. They followed their hope in the light of a seemingly far off star. Make notice, their great joy and excitement came in seeing the star's message before ever seeing the child.

In the business of this season and days, how many of us, instead of driving the Christmas message, have allowed the Christmas message to drive us on such a journey of faith. To trust both the message and messenger. To follow the hope and promise this child's coming, life, death, and resurrection hold for us all. To leave our old lives behind and journey in faith to a new place of life, light and joy.

I invite us all to embark this Christmas season on such a journey.


If you have difficulty getting to worship and would like to have the Pastor serve you the Lord's Supper at home, please call the church office (435-628-9158).

We recently have been pleased to welcome to our congregation, Marsha and Bob Besch, Dottie Amland, Gayle Prentice and Karen Barkoff.

As we go through the Winter months, we trust you will be diligent about maintaining the wellness of an important person - YOU! Some experts have been warning we may be subject to a possible Tripledemic as Flu, COVID and RSV could reach their prevalence together. Others are encouraged by evidence that viruses fight with each other to gain dominance and believe we may be spared the "perfect storm" of all three peaking at one time. Regardless, each virus can cause serious illness and poses a threat, especially, to young children, the elderly and those with compromised immunity. Fortunately, this year's flu vaccine seems to be a good match for the circulating virus. The available COVID bivalent booster has been shown to be effective against Omicron variants by boosting waning antibody levels. And while there is no universal vaccine against RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus), a vaccine is available for very young children and children with compromised immunity.

Although we have grown exhausted and perhaps dismissive of the recommendations of the past two years, the recent recommendations for disease prevention still prevail. As you make your plans for gatherings with loved ones and others during this holiday season, plan, also, to protect both yourself and those you care about by:

- Being vaccinated for Flu and COVID
- Covering your mouth or sneezing/coughing into your bent elbow
- Masking up in densely congregated groups and public transportation
- Washing your hands frequently and using sanitizer
- Testing for COVID the day of gathering for holiday celebrations
- Staying home, disheartening as it may be, if you feel sick

# Mission/Outreach

First, thanks to everyone who participated in our fall events: Operation Christmas Child and the C.R.O.P. Walk.

We set a goal of 150 boxes for Operation Christmas Child for 2022 and we fell just short. As a church we packed 147 boxes, up from 2021 but far short of our record 225 in 2017. Thanks to everyone who packed a box or helped us pack 108 boxes at our packing party in October. We have some empty boxes left over and if anyone wants to get a head start on 2023, please let me know and I'll be happy to get you the boxes you need.

The 13<sup>th</sup> Annual St. George CROP Walk was held on Saturday, November 12<sup>th</sup>. Eight members of the congregation joined us in walking six miles - representing the average distance that someone in a developing country walks EACH DAY just to get food and water. We were also joined by Mayor Kress Staheli of Washington City and Councilwoman Danielle Larkin of St. George. The total donations received is still being tabulated but they first report is that \$3,675 was raised this year and Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church contributed \$800 to the total.

We were pleased to have our Mission Co-Worker Ellen Smith with us on November 6<sup>th</sup>. She led our Adult Education class and made a presentation on the situation in Ukraine and Eastern Europe during a fellowship potluck. Her message was powerful, and it reminds us to keep all of those affected by the war in Ukraine in our prayers.

#### **Session News**

Session held their monthly meeting on November 13<sup>th</sup>. Here is a synopsis of the actions that were taken:

- Approved to receive Karen Barkoff into membership of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church. She will be introduced to and received by the congregation on November 20, 2022.
- Approved to allow the Deacons to manage the parish structure and membership without explicit approval from Session.
- Approved to allocate up to \$500 from the Building budget for restocking cleaning supplies and \$750 from the Building budget to obtain an appraisal of our buildings for insurance purposes.
- Approved to authorize the expenditure of \$1,080.00 to cover the shipping donation for the 108 Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes packed by the church. Funds to come from Local Mission.
- Approved to amend the authorization by Session on September 11, 2022, to increase the amount of Ellen Smith's airfare from \$1,000.00 to \$1212.70 to be paid for from the Russia Mission Fund.
- Approved to authorize the expenditure of \$500 as a donation to Pastor Sergei and the church in Dorogobuzh for their Christmas programs for children.
- Approved to authorize the expenditure of \$1,000 as a donation to Pastor Sergei and the church in Dorogobuzh to pay for the occupancy certificate for their building addition.

The next meeting of the Session will be Sunday, December 11<sup>th</sup> at 12:00 Noon in the CE Building.

# **Building Fund Update**

When we took out our mortgage, we estimated that we needed \$384,000 to pay off the mortgage and have the resources to meet our needs for maintaining and improving our facilities. Now that our mortgage has been retired, we have turned our attention to several major maintenance items and improvements that need to be addressed over the next several years. These projects, totaling more than \$145,000, need to be funded. We still need your help.

Through **November 20<sup>th</sup>** we have received pledges towards our third campaign totaling **\$56,100** and additional cash donations of **\$68,072** giving us a total for all three campaigns of **\$319,235** or about **83.1** of our **\$384,000** goal.
