Solar Electric System Progressing

If you've been at church recently you've probably noticed some work going on in the "Back 40" as Scott Florence used to call the west end of the property.

As has been reported, the church received a large bequest from the estate of Paul and Gloria Reynolds, and we are moving forward with using a part of that bequest to install a sizeable Solar Electric System (SES) that will help to reduce our power bills and our impact on our planet.

The first step needed to install an SES that is built on the ground is to clear and level the area where the system is going to be installed. After discussion we decided to clear not only the area for the SES but the entire west end of the property. This will provide us with additional security and will improve the visual appeal of our church property. That work is now complete as you can see from these before and after photos:



We also need security for the system so a fence has been installed, and we are currently seeking proposals for a video security system for the SES.

The last step is the installation and commissioning of the SES, itself. We have awarded the contract to build the system to Hedgehog Electric and they are in the process of securing the necessary permits from the City of St. George and ordering the equipment to install the system. We hope to have the system up and running before full-on air conditioning season begins in June.

We know that Paul and Gloria would have approved of our plan to use part of their bequest and are smiling down on us as we make it a reality.

April is Per Capita Month

With Easter behind us, April is Per Capita Month at Good Shepherd.

Per capita is an amount of money this year, \$42.35) that our congregation pays to the larger Presbyterian Church (USA) for each member. This money enables us to work with other Presbyterian churches in our Presbytery and across the country. It is also money that allows us to work with other churches to further the mission of Jesus Christ around the world.

You may have noticed the blue envelopes in the pews, marked "Per Capita." We are asking each member to contribute their per capita cost for the year. The 2024 per capita payment due from Good Shepherd is just over \$10,000. By contributing your portion of per capita, you free up dollars in our regular budget for the work of our congregation in our community.

We thank each of you for your continued support of our mission.



Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

And behold, on that very day two of them were going to a village named Emmaus, which was sixty stadia from Jerusalem. And they were talking with each other about all these things which had taken place. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus Himself approached and began traveling with them. Luke 24:13-15 (NASB)



This coming Sunday we will collectively declare, "He is Risen, He is Risen Indeed". We will rejoice together in the message and truth of the Resurrection. Now what?

The motion picture industry has depicted that first morning as a "happily ever after" event. However, the Gospel of Luke tells a different story. Luke tells us of two of Jesus's disciples who, upon hearing of the empty tomb and the risen Lord, rather than rejoice and believe, decide it is time to "get out of Dodge", or rather Jerusalem, and head south.

Amazingly, they could not escape our Lord's presence when He began to travel with them, though they did not recognize him at first. It was not until later, when the bread was broken and shared, that they recognized him.

I wonder how many of us have made or are making the same journey. With the Hallelujah Chorus and ham dinner we will depart in the same way we arrived. We continue our life's journey as if nothing has changed. We return to our "normal" lives, not realizing that the one we declare risen now walks with us every day whether we recognize Him or not.

Yet, at that moment we do recognize Him, His presence and love in our hearts and lives, like the disciples of Emmaus, our eyes are opened, and we see everything has changed, we have changed, and with our Lord we are risen to new life in His name.

It is my prayer for all of us that we all may have our eyes open this post Easter/Resurrection season and see the one who is walking with us, and always will.

And then their eyes were opened and they recognized Him; and He vanished from their sight. They said to one another, "Were our hearts not burning within us when He was speaking to us on the road, while He was explaining the Scriptures to us?" And they got up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found the eleven gathered together and those who were with them, saying, "The Lord has really risen and has appeared to Simon!" They began to relate their experiences on the road, and how He was recognized by them at the breaking of the bread. Luke 24:13-15 (NASB)

- Approved a request by Rev. Clingan for vacation on April 5-6-2024. Approved training for Rev. Clingan in a leadership position in the General Assembly on April 7-10, 2024, in Louisville, KY.
- Approved Ann Abbott as Treasurer effective April 1, 2024.

Church Safety Workshop April 21st

With all the news about attacks on churches and other religious meetings, we have scheduled a workshop on Church Safety for Sunday, April 21st from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm in Conklin Hall. The workshop is free and anyone who is interested is welcome to attend.

This presentation and conversation are based on the best of the FBI's research and advice, as well as the Colorado Attorney's General Office, which has responded to so many acts of violence in public spaces, that they have a compelling story for how to think about prevention.

The Moderator will be the Rev Hansen Wendlandt, from Community of Grace Presbyterian in Sandy. Hansen is not an expert on these issues, but he has been through two rounds of FBI training, helped several congregations through this discussion, built strong relationships with law enforcement agencies, and dealt with real threats in a church setting.
