# **Church Financial Situation Is Concerning**

As you've no doubt heard, our church is in the early stages of a significant financial shortfall. We simply are not receiving enough in donations, both pledged and unpledged, to meet our basic costs.

On average in 2024 we have spent about \$20,085 each month, which is less than our average budgeted amount by about \$1,300. Unfortunately, we have only received an average of about \$16,650, about \$4,765 below our average monthly budget leaving us with an average deficit of about \$3,465 each month. To date, through July, we have spent \$24,000 more than we have received.

Like our personal budgets, the vast majority of our spending is nondiscretionary. We can cut around the edges by, for example, not making color copies, turning the thermostats up a couple of degrees and buying less expensive items to operate the church but those savings are minimal.

Of the total budget of \$258,443 for the year, only about \$14,000, or 5.4%, are expenses not involved with personnel or keeping the church buildings and programs running in a way that enhances our congregational fellowship and service. That \$14,000 includes our most important expenditure: for Mission.

In short, we need your help. Many of you made pledges at the end of 2023 so that we could get a good idea of how much money we expected to receive. We thank you for that. Unfortunately, we have received only 78% of the amount of pledge offerings that we should have received through the end of July. Our nonpledged offerings are about 72% of what we expected to receive through July.

We have an opportunity to fix the problem. If you made a pledge, please ensure that your pledge payments are up to date. You will receive a statement soon showing your giving for the year. If you haven't paid your Per Capita, please do so. If you can find a way to give us just a bit more each month, we would thank you.

We realize that many of us are stretched thin by the current economic climate, but without your financial help, we will be forced into a situation that none of us wants to be in.

Please prayerfully consider your giving and help us if you can do so.



*So, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, walk in him, rooted in him and built upon him and established in the faith as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. Colossians 2:6-7 (NASB)*

### **Congregational Growth & Care**

The word "hospice" has its origins in a Latin word "hospitum" from which we get our word, "hospitality," meaning a place of rest and protection by a host not only for the weary traveler but also for the sick. Although they didn't last long, it is thought that hospices were available for care to ill or dying pilgrims to the Holy Land with history showing that the first hospice was opened in Rhodes in the early 14<sup>th</sup> century. In the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, France is credited with reviving the hospice movement and Roman Catholic healthcare has always included hospice care and shelter.

Development of the modern Hospice movement can be credited to a British nurse, Cicely Sanders. In the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century, when caring for terminally ill patients, she recognized the need for focusing not only on a patient's disease but also focusing on addressing all types of distress that the patient and family were experiencing: physical, emotional, social and spiritual. In fact, nurse Saunders believed so strongly in this philosophy that she became a physician to have more power to implement her ideas. She introduced her movement to the US at Yale in 1963. Dr. Florence Wald, Dean of the Yale School of Nursing, took up the cause and the American Hospice movement was born.

We have shared this history about Hospice because at our Lunch & Learn program on Wednesday, September 18<sup>th</sup> from 12:00 Noon to 1:00 pm, we will welcome speakers from Renew Home Health and Hospice. Director of Nursing, Janice Millett, and nurses will be discussing what we are calling, "How Do You Want to Go?" - know your options for home care and hospice. They will discuss the role of the caregiver and ramifications of hospice and perhaps dispel misconceptions about what is meant by being "under hospice care." Not only are they coming to be our speakers, but they also will bring sandwiches for our lunch! We'll provide treats and beverages. So - no excuse - come have lunch with us on September 18<sup>th</sup> and become informed about this important topic. As we have emphasized this year, be as proactive as you can be in planning for YOUR future physical and financial needs while you are able to make such decisions.

### **Stewardship**

The financial situation of our church is a concern for us all. We are facing three opportunities which call for our help. First, the Pledges we have made for 2024 are \$12,593 less than what we have budgeted for Pledge income for the year. Second, on top of pledging less than we need, we have given less than we have pledged to give by a stunning \$22,599. So we haven't pledged enough to cover the costs of operating our church and our missions, and we have not given all that we have pledged we would give. The third problem is that gifts on Sunday mornings in the offering plates are \$11,253 less than we expected based on previous year giving.

The total of these three opportunities is a breathtaking \$46,445. Our total budget for the year is \$258,443. So our deficit for pledges and other giving is nearly 20% of our total budget. You will surely understand the significance of this situation.

So, we encourage you to consider your giving to support your church and its missions. If you haven't pledged, please consider a pledge for the balance of the year. If you have pledged, please confirm that your giving matches your pledge, and if it doesn't, please consider when and how you can make up the difference.

We all want to see our church thrive and continue all of its programs for our congregation and our missions for our community and the world. Your help is needed currently. Please pray for our church and its work. Thank you.
