Growing Our Future

In November 2024, we announced the formation of the Growing Our Future committee, charged with understanding the needs of our Congregation and exploring various ideas for marketing our Church to newcomers. The development-phase team has been meeting since October 2024 and recently submitted "conceptual recommendations" to Session for approval. The following initiatives were approved by Session:

- Conduct a survey of the Congregation to better understand the demographics of our members, how they came to join our church, and how they use today's communication tools.
- Implement a trial campaign which will use post-card mailings to introduce our church to people who have recently moved into the greater St. George area.
- If warranted by our survey, engage professional assistance to improve to our web page (GSPCSG.org) as a tool for attracting newcomers and to raise its visibility within internet search engines.
- Investigate potential subscription-based Church Management Programs to aid in more effective and efficient communication with our members.

We expect to roll out the member survey which will be conducted, for the most part, by email, in February. For members who do not typically use email communication, we will also distribute paper versions of the surveys at Church services during that month.

As we progress through 2025 with the implementation phase of the project, we would benefit greatly by assistance from other members of the Congregation. If you are moved to help with "Growing Our Future" please contact Virginia Hunt or Alicia Kitzman.

Souper Bowl of Caring February 9th



Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

This past year has been for our congregation a time of change, in other words, transitions. And while change is always a difficult word, as the Psalmist says, "we will not fear, the Lord of host is with us."

We witnessed the transition from our long-time organist, Stephen Talley, who retired in May to the very capable Aaron Lund. We witnessed the transition from our long time Music Director Emerita Elder Barbara McConnell in August to Dr. Paul Wiens as our Interim Music Director.

This has led to a reorganization of our music program ending the year with Paul Wiens as Music and Bell Choir Director and with the addition of Kathy Brown as our Chancel Choir Director. As I said this has been a time of transition and we are very fortunate to have these gifted music personnel serving in the Worship of our congregation! Now with the new program in place we are in the process of building both our Chancel and Bell Choirs. Consider joining one or both!

We continue to strongly support our local mission causes. Our relationship with our sister church in Russia remains strong. It has been challenging maintaining our relationship in the face of a three-year-old war between Russia and Ukraine. Communication has been restricted but still doable. Pastor Sergei has expressed his heartfelt gratitude to God and all of you!

In response, the Eastern European Partner Network (EEPN) has established contact with other partners in the neighboring nations of Poland, Lithuania, Romania and Moldova. We have expanded our mission support for two projects in Moldova, a Church World Service refugee center in Balti and YMCA Moldova in Chisinau, Moldova.

We were very pleased to be one of the hosts for Presbyterian International Peacemaker Dimitri Roibu, the director of YMCA Moldova who presented a program on his work and service to our congregation as well as several groups in Saint George.

We continue our active participation and support of the St. George Area Interfaith Council. This year we were the second largest contributor to the annual CROP Walk. This was our most successful CROP Walk raising \$10,600 for local and international hunger programs.

The transition continues even in the face of some challenges. We know whose guiding hand continues to shepherd us throughout these days and times. Our Lord and Savior continues to call us into a new and bright future that we have only begun to enter. The transition continues. "The Lord of Hosts is with us, the God of Jacob is our refuge."

In the meantime, I want to express my great appreciation to our congregation who have remained positive, supportive, generous, faithful and hopeful with a loving Christian spirit throughout these days.

The Lord is near, and he has led us through these days and now into the future. And I continue to give thanks to Him for you all.

Session News

Session held their monthly meeting on January 12, 2025. The following actions were taken:

- Approved to receive Mark and Patti Eddington into membership of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church.
- Approved, in concept, the recommendations of the Growing Our Future Subcommittee: 1) a survey of the members, 2) a postcard marketing campaign to new residents moving into the area, 3) Specifications and bids for a local Web Site Design Firm including search engine optimization techniques, 4) Evaluate the use of Planning Center Church Operating System. All results of research shall be brought to the Session for approval prior to implementation.
- Approved to transfer an additional \$60 from Rev. Clingan's General Expenses to his HRA, retroactive to December 31, 2024, to cover health-related expenses that were incorrectly charged to his general expenses.
- Appointed Ruthanne Skinner to be Good Shepherd's Commissioner to Presbytery for 2025.
- Approve a Study Leave for Rev. Clingan to attend the Presbytery's Pastor and CLP Spring Retreat on March 6-8, 2025
- Accepted a quote from Desert Falls Landscaping for removal of juniper bushes and replacement of landscaping rock in an amount not to exceed \$800 to be taken from the Building Fund.
- Approved as per the previously approved 2024 General Fund Budget, the following Churchwide Mission donations:
 - \$2,000 to Ellen Smith, Presbyterian Mission Co-worker for Eastern Europe
 - $_{\odot}$ $\$ \$1,000 to the YMCA of Moldova for programs to aid Ukrainian refugees.
 - \circ $\ \$ \$500 to Friends of Moldova's programs to aid Ukrainian refugees.
 - \circ \$1,500 to Presbytery for general Churchwide Mission
- Approved the appointment of Ann Abbott as Treasurer for 2025.
- Approved the appointment of Ruth Ann Horvath as Session Clerk for 2025.
- Approved the appointment of Elder Ruthanne Skinner to serve as Elder-Moderator of the 2025 Nominating Committee.

Session News, continued

- Approved to set the second Sunday of each month at 12:00 Noon in the CE Building as the Stated Session Meetings for 2025 and January 2026
- Approved to set the first Sunday of each month as the dates of Communion for 2025 and on the first Sunday in January 2026. Approved to serve Communion at every Sunday Prayer Service, Maundy Thursday Service (April 17, 2025) and to members who are shut ins. During June, July, and August communion will be served by intinction.
- Approved a Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan Resolution covering the 2025 year and establishing the annual HRA covered expenses for Rev. Clingan be set at a total of \$6,500 for 2025.
- Approved to appoint a commission consisting of Rev. Ralph Clingan and Ruth Ann Horvath to prepare 2024 PCUSA Annual Statistical Report.
- Held a Corporation Meeting and elected 2025 Corporation Officers: Chris Schleter, President; Celeste Renta, Vice-President; Ruth Ann Horvath, Secretary; Ann Abbott, Treasurer.
- Next Session meeting will be on Saturday, February 9, 2025, at 12 Noon in the Christian Education Building.

Other Session actions outside of the January 12 meeting:

- At a Stated Congregational Meeting on 12-15-2024, the congregation approved the 2025 Terms of Call of the pastor and accepted the report of the Nominating Committee, electing three elders and five deacons
- Approved by E-vote on January 16, 2025, a request from Mark Eddington to be baptized.

The next meeting of the Session will be Sunday, February 9, 2025, at 12:00 Noon in the CE Building.


