Rev. Ralph Clingan Announces Retirement

At the Session meeting on Sunday, February 9th, our Pastor, Rev. Ralph Clingan, announced that it was his intention to retire on June 30, 2025. He quoted Ecclesiastes 3: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven," stating that after a long period of prayerful discernment, he had determined that it was time for this season of his life to end and a new one to begin. Session approved his Honorable Retirement and thanked him for his service. It was an emotional meeting both for Rev. Ralph and all of the members of Session. We will hold a celebration of his time with us as we get closer to June 30th. We will hold a congregational meeting on June 29th to formally dissolve his call as our Pastor.

Rev. Ralph sent a letter to each member of our congregation that was delivered on Monday, February 10th. In it, he expressed his gratitude to all of the Good Shepherd family.

Rev. Ralph was called as our third Pastor on November 1, 2005, and has served our congregation faithfully for nearly 20 years. As he noted, "In the 20 years I have served the Lord in serving you we have witnessed and lived through, with the Lord's help, the Great Recession, wars around our world, and a worldwide pandemic. We have laughed, cried and prayed together." The next few months will be an opportunity to remember our time together and give thanks to the Lord that Ralph has been a part of our faith journey.

Rev. Mirjam Haas-Melchior, Executive Presbyter of the Presbytery of Utah was also present in the meeting to offer guidance on what lies ahead for us.

The next step in our church life will be to hire an interim pastor. Rev. Haas-Melchior noted that there are very few specialist interim pastors available and has recommended someone to Session. Session members have begun the process of considering candidates and are working to have someone in place by the beginning of August, at the latest. Elder Ray Snipes is leading the Session in the search for the interim pastor. Should we not have an interim pastor in place when Rev. Ralph retires, we will utilize supply ministers to fill the gap.

From July 1st through the middle of 2026 we will be in a period of recovering from the loss of Rev. Ralph's service to our congregation, a period of mourning, if you will, and a period of discernment of God's purpose for our congregational mission going forward.

In mid-2026, the congregation will elect a Pastor Nominating Committee whose charge will be to seek candidates to be our next called Pastor, vet those candidates and ultimately, with God's guidance and the approval of the congregation, call Good Shepherd's fourth Pastor.

Every church goes through this process periodically and it is now our season for doing so. We wish Rev. Ralph health, success and happiness in his retirement and thank him for his service to our congregation and God's church.

Yet, in this past year I have been in prayerful discernment of the journey that our Lord has called us to. I believe it is His will and my time for this season in my life to come to an end, and a new one to begin. It is time for this season, as Pastor of the Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church, to end and for both of us to enter a new season of promise and hope.

At February's meeting of the Session, I asked for the approval of my Honorable Retirement as Pastor of the Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church, effective June 30, 2025, and that a congregational meeting be called June 29, 2025, for the purpose of dissolving the pastoral relationship between us.

This season has been a wonderful journey that I shall forever be grateful for to our Lord Jesus Christ, and to you!

Change is Upon Us

With the announcement of Rev. Ralph's coming retirement, change has been on the minds of everyone associated with Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church. Changing pastors creates feelings of loss: loss of a friend, loss of routine, loss of the comfort that having a long-term leader creates. It creates uncertainty. It forces us to look at ourselves and find ways to cope and to move forward. Change is inevitable. No pastor stays with a church forever and we have been blessed by God to have Rev. Ralph as our pastor for nearly 20 years. We will have a period of uncertainty and feelings of loss, just as the church did when Rev. John Mahon left us, but we will move forward and, with God's guidance, overcome our sense of loss and find peace, joy and purpose again.

At each month's Session meeting, Rev. Ralph asks a member of Session to present a devotional on a topic suggested to them by the Holy Spirit during the month. Elder Chris Schleter presented the devotional at the February meeting. It was entitled "Change is Good". In this time of change in our Church life, we thought you might like to read what he shared.

Change is Good

In Ecclesiastes 3, we learn that "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh, ...You know the rest.

Have you ever taken a moment to notice the beauty in the change of seasons? Think about it. With each season, there is something to appreciate and celebrate. Springtime announces the end of Winter. It represents the beginning of hope and new life. With plants blossoming and a shift into warm weather, Spring is a time to appreciate the newness in nature. After Spring, there's Summer. Many would say it represents freedom and relaxation. Vacations, the blaring sun, and an abundance of outdoor activities is what this season brings. Some may even say it brings about new energy and the urge to get active.

After Summer, there's Autumn or Fall. This time of the year often represents preparation, preservation, and comfort. Fall often brings about a sense of comfort. A shift from hot weather to just right warmth coupled with the beautiful colors' leaves turn, baking, apple cider, and harvest time is what this season is often associated with. Last but not least, Winter. Often associated with bitterly cold weather, hot cocoa, snow, giving, family gatherings, and the gleeful holiday season. Each time of the year brings something to look forward to and celebrate.

Each year, nature shows us how and why change is necessary. So why are we so reluctant to face and accept it? When you think about it, you realize that all of nature's changes depend on God. As each season begins and ends, things that come about with them are natural, and each of them depends on God's care and grace. Could you imagine if there were only one season to experience? What would things look like? Would we be able to experience this portion of God's grace and beauty?

Change is inevitable. It's unavoidable. It brings about the unexpected, things we didn't plan for. Whether good or bad, it comes with something new. It pushes us out of our comfort zone. It forces us to adjust to circumstances we may or may not have been ready for. However, no matter how ready or reluctant we are to make or embrace change, one thing is for certain: God is with us every step of the way. I believe what we fail to realize is that God orchestrates the changes in our lives for His glory and our good. We do this because we tend to make our plans and trust in them. When we do this, we create the outcome we desire. When things don't go the way we anticipate we become disheveled. This shouldn't be. Why? Because as believers our trust should be in God and our will should be His will, changes and all.

God is aware of all that goes on in our lives. He creates the plans; He creates the changes. Shifts in life are a part of His plan. Whether we like it or not, we all know God's plans are always best.
