Scammers Target Good Shepherd Members

Beginning on August 23rd several of our members began receiving emails coming from either Rev. Celeste (Rev Celeste Lasich <pastor872992@gmail.com>) or Rev. (sic) Celeste Renta (Rev Celeste Renta <pastor752170@gmail.com>). These emails did not come from either of the Celestes and are scams. The addresses are bogus. Please **DO NOT RESPOND** to these emails. Please let us know if you received one.

Initially, the scammers do not ask for anything specific, and the initial emails have just included a line like "Plan for tomorrow's service?" or something similar. When you respond they will ask for gift cards.

We have not heard about any text scams in the last few weeks but be alert for texts that are similar to these emails. If you get a text, please **DO NOT RESPOND** and let us know the number that texted you.

To help you avoid being victimized in scams like this, please consider the following:

- No one from the church will email or text you to ask for money, gift cards, crypto or anything of the like. These communications are from scammers trying to separate you from your money.
- ALWAYS look at the email address of the person sending the email - if it doesn't look right, it usually isn't. Similarly, for texts if you don't recognize the number of the person sending the text and there is no Caller ID it is likely a scam. DO NOT RESPOND in either case.
- If there are multiple typos or misspellings in the email or text, assume it is a scam. Many times the scammers are not native speakers of English and over the years, many of the scams we have seen originate in Nigeria.

If you want to confirm the contents of the email or text, please DO NOT RESPOND and contact the actual sender directly. Pastor Celeste's email is celeste.lasich@gmail.com and Celeste Renta's is celesteren@aol.com.

We see this behavior occasionally so please be vigilant and always let us know if you receive any strange emails or texts purporting to be from the church.

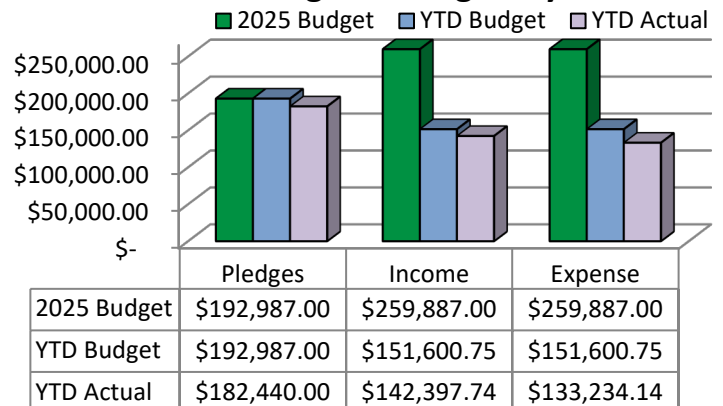

On the Journey... with Pastor Celeste

Be Thou My Vision



On my mom's side, one of our family names is McClung: believed to mean, by way of Latin, "son of a seafarer." The history of the Celtic lands is complicated, especially for descendants of Scots Protestants. My grandmother Harriet, who was born and raised in Appalachian West Virginia was Covenanter Scots Presbyterian. They centered their life and worship entirely on the Bible, so much so that they rejected all art as graven images and sung only psalms with no musical accompaniment. I confess I would not have been a good Covenanter Presbyterian. I have always been drawn to the beauty of Celtic music, imagery and theology.

My crosses are mostly Celtic, originating on the island of Iona. The island is part of the Inner Hebrides off the west coast of Scotland. The circle originally supported the weight of massive, chiseled stone cross beams, indigenous to that rocky wind-swept land. Iona High Crosses tower at 10-16 feet, visible for miles.

Iona has long been a "thin place" of worship and pilgrimage since 563 AD, when St. Columba and 12 companions founded the Iona Abbey, considered the birthplace of Christianity in Scotland. At this point I've been to Scotland three times, on week-long pilgrimages to Iona, the Holy Island of Lindisfarne and other beloved places. I always leave Iona and Scotland with the farewell "until next time."

Since a young age, *Be Thou My Vision*, with its lilting Celtic tune, Slane, has been a favorite hymn and prayer. I find myself humming or singing the verses for encouragement and guidance. My heart's desire is that my vision and way in the world is in keeping with God's vision.

*Be thou my vision, O Lord of my heart;
not be all else to me, save that thou art.
Thou my best thought, by day or by night,
waking or sleeping thy presence my light.*

Where are the places and what are the hymns, praise and spiritual music that speak to you? I look forward to hearing your stories of God's presence along your life's journey. I'm so grateful for God's unfailing presence on the journey of faith. Thank you, people of Good Shepherd, for the warm welcome you've given me! I'm looking forward to getting to know you all as we journey together.

In his book on HOW TO PRAY, Peter Grieg, shares that our English word prayer derives from the Latin **precarius**. We pray because life is precarious. We pray because life is marvelous. As Christian we pray because we want to pray like Jesus. According to Luke 11:1,

One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.'

The Journey Is the Destination

A Devotional by Wendy Hopley

"Now listen, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money.' Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that.'"

James 4:13-15 NIV

Excitement turned to disappointment for me as I read a sign saying the road to Mount Mitchell was closed. My husband and I had planned to visit the summit of Mount Mitchell, the highest mountain in the eastern United States. Hiking at the mountain's summit was the highlight of our trip itinerary. We had been looking forward to it for a long time. But when we arrived, we encountered many other disappointed people turning their cars around after reading that the road was closed. It was such a windy day that a tree may have fallen over the road, but the sign gave no official reason for the closure. I struggled to stay positive as we drove away from the one destination I had wanted to visit the most on our trip to North Carolina. But farther down the Blue Ridge Parkway, we discovered a visitor center that was open. In the gift shop, we found souvenir hoodies that featured this slogan promoting the parkway: "The journey is the destination." Reflecting on that changed my mindset. What's most important on our journey through life isn't a specific destination. It's the journey itself – the adventure we go on with Jesus from day to day.

We can make all sorts of bucket list plans. But those individual goals are far less important than simply enjoying the journey with Jesus. Rather than focusing on a specific destination, we grow in holiness as we follow where Jesus leads us. We can find ourselves in unexpected, surprising places. Our best, most carefully crafted plans can be completely changed.

Our future is uncertain. From our perspective, we can't predict it. But from God's omniscient perspective, everything is clear. Only God knows what will happen in our lives from day to day. God has great purposes for our lives, and he will help us fulfill those purposes no matter what happens.

So, when we make plans, we need to do so with flexibility. We shouldn't expect that our plans will never fall through. James 4:15 urges us: *"Instead, you ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that.'"* Every plan we make in our fallen world is uncertain. But God's good plans for us are certain. God tells us in Jeremiah 29:11: *"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'"* God alone holds our future in his hands. As Proverbs 19:21 points out: *"Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails."*

When we acknowledge God's sovereignty in our plans, it transforms our perspective. We begin to see our lives not as a series of calculated moves, but as a journey guided by God's purposes. We learn to hold our plans loosely. We allow room for God to intervene and redirect our paths according to his will. That frees us from the anxiety that's tied to our desire for certainty. We release the burden of trying to control every outcome and instead rest in the assurance that God is orchestrating every detail for good purposes.

So, as we make plans, let's do so with hearts surrendered to God's will. We can find joy in the journey even when our path seems uncertain. God will be with us every step of the way!
