Stewardship Campaign Kicks Off October 19th

Our annual Stewardship campaign will kick off on Stewardship Sunday, October 19th. The theme of this year's campaign is "Growing Our Church." We want this to be a time to find ways to grow our church, by bearing fruit and deepening our roots, not just by growing numbers.

We will kick off the campaign on October 19th with a short program during fellowship after church. We will talk more about what "Growing Our Church" means and what steps we can take to grow our mission and our outreach to our community. For those who are interested, we will have available copies of our Narrative Budget and detailed budget for next year.

We will continue the campaign during worship on October 26th, November 2nd, November 9th and November 16th with spotlights on several areas of emphasis for our church.

We will wrap things up on November 23rd, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, with the dedication of our pledges for 2026.

We hope each of you will come prepared with ideas and questions as we begin our journey to 2026 and beyond.

Reformation Sunday October 26th

As is our tradition, we will celebrate Reformation Sunday on October 26th. We'll have bagpipes for worship and recognize and commemorate Martin Luther's nailing his 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, in 1517. If you are of Scottish descent, please sign the list in Conklin Hall and tell us your Clan then wear your tartan to church on Reformation Sunday.

CROP Walk November 8th

This year's CROP Hunger Walk, sponsored by the St. George Interfaith Council, marks the 16th annual walk held since 2009. The previous walks have raised \$95,992 for hunger programs, both locally and worldwide through Church World Service. Last year's walk raised \$10,764 which crushed the previous record of \$8,109 set in 2011. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds from the walk remain in our area, supporting Solomon's Porch's Friday Pantry and Sunday Feast.

The festivities begin at Larkspur Park in Bloomington Hills at 9:45 am on November 8th, with introductions from the Interfaith Council, recognition of participating groups and comments from St. George Mayor Michelle Randall and Washington City Mayor Kress Staheli. The walk is six miles - the average distance those in the developing world must walk each day to get food and water or to go to work.

If you would like to walk, please pick up an envelope from Chris Schleiter, beginning October 19th, raise as much money as you can from family and friends, and bring your envelope back on November 2nd where the congregation will have the chance to add to your donations. Good Shepherd finished second in donations last year. Let's get back on top in 2025.



On the Journey ... with Pastor Celeste

This is My Song

This Is My Song to the Finlandia tune by Jean Sibelius, is an inspiring testimony that our God can never be limited to any one nation. It is one of my favorite hymns and hymn tunes.

On the first Sunday in October, Christians around the globe celebrate World Communion Sunday, this year on October 5th. If ever there was a time to remember our unity in Jesus Christ throughout the world, perhaps it is now. World Communion Sunday was conceived by the Presbyterian Church in 1933 as a display of Christian unity and an opportunity for congregations to see how they are interconnected to one another. It became a worldwide ecumenical effort during World War II. Presbyterian Church historian Davitt S. Bell reflects on that time, saying it symbolized an effort "to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

In the mid 2000's, I was part of an online international clergy group. Over many years we delighted in sharing World Communion greetings from our local churches in New Zealand, South Africa, France, Scotland, England, Canada and throughout the US. With siblings around the world, we meet Christ at the Table of Grace.

World Communion Sunday is a time for remembering that around the globe—in different languages, with different traditions and customs, and in various forms of liturgy—the Lord's Supper is celebrated. At its best World Communion Sunday serves two purposes: it is both a joyous and meaningful partaking in Jesus' sacred meal with his friends and a mind-opening exposure to the ways by God's grace, we are joined in Christ around the world.

"Long enough , God - you've ignored me long enough. I've looked at the back of your head long enough. Long enough. I've carried this ton of trouble, lived with a stomach full of pain. Long enough my arrogant enemies have looked down their noses at me. I've thrown myself headlong into your arms - I'm celebrating your rescue. I'm singing at the top of my lungs. Everything you ever wanted to know about the desert tortoise — or almost - was revealed on September 10th. We were very pleased to have Ann McLuckie, a member of our church and wildlife biologist, as our speaker for Lunch and Learn. Ann brought both a sixty-year-old tortoise, Goliath, and a little hatchling. She also brought her vast knowledge about the reptiles, which are native to Utah. She titled her talk, "Shellbound - Natural History of the Desert Tortoise" and we were enlightened by not only what she had to tell us but also an excellent video presentation, as well. The desert tortoise is a prime example of excellence in evolution and adaptation because of how it has become able to live to one hundred years of age in the harsh desert environment. Disturbingly, we also heard that disease, untoward action by humans and urbanization have encroached on their habitats resulting in a quantifiable reduction in the number of tortoises in this area. To learn more about these magnificent creatures and view Ann's presentation, you are invited to go to the church's YouTube channel. Attendees will perform CPR on mannequins provided by the instructor. Please consider attending to either brush up your skills or learn new ones. You never know when you might be called upon to help in an emergency.
