

On the Journey ... with Pastor Celeste

*For Everything there is a Season (Turn, Turn, Turn)
To everything, turn, turn, turn
There is a season, turn, turn, turn
And a time to every purpose under heaven...
Ecclesiastes 3:1*

I'm grateful for the time with folks who were able to attend the December 3rd Lunch and Learn, *Pastor Celeste is Here, Now What?* I'm excited to see how God will use this Interim time to reveal plans and promises. In this newsletter I want to share more on what to expect through this Interim process. Warning- this is long but important!

The January 25, 2026, Annual Meeting will kick off the Mission Study with the Wall of Wonder. Intrigued? It's an opportunity to start with you and your history with Good Shepherd. You will help add the events and people who have been significant to who Good Shepherd is and is becoming. The Wall will stay up for a week or so to allow time for those of you not at the annual meeting to add to your highlights. Members, friends, visitors, all are welcome!

Subsequent Mission Study gatherings will ask you to identify Good Shepherd's deepest values and identity, as well as resources, assets and passions for ministry. You only need to attend one for each month as the topic and questions will be the same throughout the month. Everyone - members, friends and folks who care about GSPC's future, are invited and welcome. The data from all these gatherings come together to form an honest and clear picture of Good Shepherd and will identify the qualities and capabilities your next pastor should have to thrive in ministry with you.

Through the rest of winter and spring there will be small group gatherings with open-ended questions around the monthly topic so you can share your insights and hear from others. At this point I'm planning to hold these after church on the 4th Sunday of the month and the Wednesday following 4th Sunday at Noon. I can add more days and times to include those who are not available at those times. Let me know if a better time works for you.

Here is the basic timeline flow: Mission Study small groups through spring. The Mission Study Report writing team will use the findings from the gatherings to write a formal Mission Study Report (MSR) for the Presbytery of Utah (PoU) Committee on Ministry (COM). The Mission Study Report will also include research into the demographics and current and emerging needs of this region.

After the Mission Study Report is reviewed and approved, Good Shepherd will be authorized to form a Paster Nominating Committee (PNC) through the Nominating Committee. Election of the PNC should occur in the fall. The PNC will receive orientation and support to create Good Shepherd's Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP). Much of the PNC's work is done online so potential PNC members need to be comfortable using online resources. The MDP acts as the "Job Posting" for the PCUSA's online Leadership Connection. It must be approved by Session and PoU COM which meets monthly. The PNC will then begin conversations with interested and matched candidates.

This is a long, prayerful and careful process. You want the **right** person as your next pastor, not the **quickest**. You are inviting this person (and potentially their family) into your family. That requires many conversations with the candidates as well as those who know them well. Please remember the work of the PNC is confidential, so members of the committee will never share information about candidates until the PNC is ready to introduce their candidate to the congregation.

PoU will accompany the PNC through this process. At the December Lunch and Learn folks were able to meet Elder Jane McCoy from Cedar City, the person who will be working directly with GSPC PNC. Jane is wise, kind and practical. I'm so pleased she will be walking with the Good Shepherd PNC on this spiritual journey.

I get asked this question often, so I'll say it clearly here as well. I am not a candidate for the position. That is a wise rule and one I honor because I couldn't do the work God has called me to if I or the church had any thought I might be the next candidate. I will be with you as long as Good Shepherd needs me. In the in-between time, pray for the person who God is even now preparing to be your next pastor. They will be blessed to be with you, as I know I am in this Interim season.
