## Souper Bowl of Caring February 8<sup>th</sup>

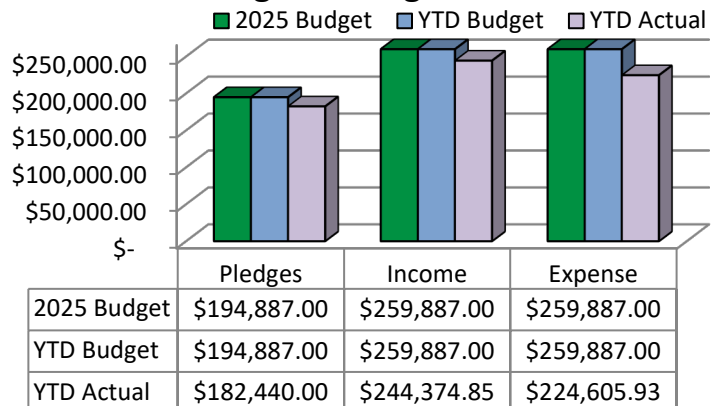

Did you know that Good Shepherd launched a new Young Adult ministry in January? Open to folks who have graduated high school to those in their 20's, OARS is a community of young adults gathering to connect with others, ask and answer life's questions and build community. OARS is a place to find friends and enjoy a free meal. I'm one of the adult mentors and LOVE the community and spirit that is growing in this group.

I'm excited to share that OARS is meeting Tuesday nights at 6:00 pm at Promise House 272 S Valley View Road next to New Promise Lutheran Church. If you are in that age range or know someone who is, come join the group!

OARS (Open, Authentic, Relevant, Spiritual) has been in the planning stage for about a year by partners Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church and New Promise Lutheran Church with guidance from Rev. Robyn Eddy of Community Presbyterian Church of Cedar City, where OARS began in the fall of 2022. OARS was CPC's response to the longing we kept hearing from young adults to have a place to ask and talk about big life questions. In Cedar, OARS is now a New Worshiping Community of the PCUSA. Good Shepherd officially joined the St George OARS partnership in September 2025.

Meals for OARS are a mix of catered and church provided. Good Shepherd will provide the meal on Tuesday February 3<sup>rd</sup>. Taco Bar is the theme for our meal. A sign-up sheet will be in Conklin Hall.

OARS is designed to be a place at the table and safe place for growing. May God delight in and bless this new ministry!

In December, we announced we'd be having a representative from the Water Conservancy District as our Lunch and Learn speaker on Wednesday, February 4<sup>th</sup>. We'll learn not only how to save money by increasing efficiency when heating and cooling our homes, but also how installation of a solar electric system on Good Shepherd property has already shown benefits of lowered HVAC costs to the church. Locally, costs for all energy have trended upward but, by more efficiently using systems already in place in our homes and considering use of solar power, we can help offset these increases. - Authorized the transfer of the \$2,000 allocated to Russia in Churchwide Mission from the General Fund to the Russia Mission Fund.

- Authorized a donation of \$1,000 to YMCA Moldova to support their work with Ukrainian refugees to be paid from Churchwide Mission.
- It was voted to appoint Chris Schleiter as Treasurer for 2026
- It was voted to appoint Celeste Renta as Session Clerk for 2026
- It was voted to appoint Ruthanne Skinner as Commissioner to Presbytery for 2026
- It was voted to appoint Scott Florence as Elder-Moderator of the 2026 Nominating Committee

Other actions taken by Session were:

- E-vote to spend \$400 for Desert Falls Landscaping to weed the community garden

## Stewardship

As we welcome a new year full of possibilities and opportunities, please pray for our church and its leaders and congregation. Our theme for the new year is Growth – growing our work in the community, our missions, our outreach, and our congregation. We hope you will pray about how you will be part of this mission.

Stewardship and our finances remain a challenge. Thank you to those who have pledged your support for this year. It enables us to plan and we are incredibly grateful. Every donation we receive frees funds for us to use in other parts of our Mission and Ministry. We'll talk a lot more about Per Capita in May.

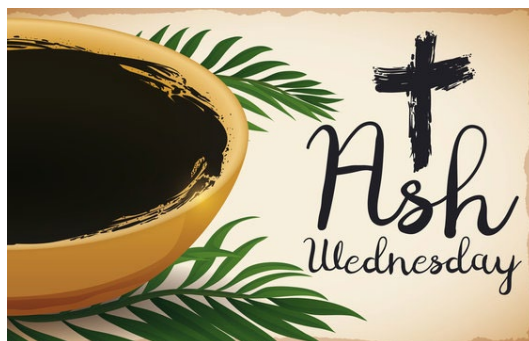
