Pledge Drives in Full Swing

As was reported last month, our pledge drives for the building expansion and the general fund for 2013 are underway.

Construction of the addition to the Fellowship Hall the new Narthex entrance is well underway. The approved cost of the project is \$175,600 and we have a monthly mortgage payment of \$1855. As of the last Sunday in November, we have received pledges totaling \$56,498, so we're a long way from having what we need to pay off the mortgage. We hope to follow our church tradition and pay off the mortgage early so please consider making a gift to the building fund.

Our tentative budget for 2013 is about \$193,000. As of the last Sunday in November, we have received pledges totaling \$84,354 or approximately 43% of our budget.

Please prayerfully consider how you can help us and make your pledge so we have the resources to fulfill God's mission for us.

Personal Hymnal Orders Due Christmas Eve

As we have been telling you, we will be ordering new hymnals before December 31. If you wish to purchase one or more hymnals for your PERSONAL use, you MUST order and pay for these hymnals not later than the Christmas Eve service on December 24. If you are purchasing one or more hymnals for the Sanctuary, you may order or pay for them at any time. Please note that the hymnals will be delivered next September.

You may order hymnals by filling out the order form found on the last page of this newsletter or in the Narthex and dropping it in the offering plate on any Sunday or mailing it to the church office. Please attach your check if you are using the paper form and write "Hymnals" on the memo line. You may also order your hymnals online at our Website gspcsg.org. You may then pay for your hymnals online by going to the Online Donation page on the Website or by dropping a check in the offering plate (be sure to write "Hymnals" on the memo line).

So far we have received orders for more than 50 hymnals for the Sanctuary and seven personal hymnals. Thank you to all who have ordered.

Brown Bag Lunch November 14 - "Scams and How to Avoid Them"

On November 14, Detective Terry Taylor from the Fraud Division of the St. George Police Department spoke with us about how we can recognize and help protect ourselves from identity theft scams and other schemes which can steal our identities. According to the FTC, identity theft, named the top complaint category for the twelfth year, is enabled by the proliferation of electronics.

Det. Taylor elaborated on the many electronic avenues of attack on our privacy available to scam artists. There may be no warning signs our identities have been compromised and our best defense is <u>self-education</u>, awareness of theft schemes and vigilance regarding transactions, such as credit card use, when our personal information must be given. Not to be overlooked is taking action to prevent identity theft of our children and grandchildren. The elderly may especially be vulnerable when emotional and fraudulent pleas for money or fantastic 'offers' are presented by telephone or e-mail, which entice them into revealing personal information and Social Security numbers. Remember – if something sounds too good to be true, it most likely is!

Basic tips for protecting our personal identity include:

- Limit the number of credit cards you hold and thoroughly inspect your financial statement each month.
- Contact the sender if you don't receive expected monthly financial statements and bills.
- Do not carry your Social Security card with you and be aware that your Medicare or medical insurance card may include your Social Security number.
- Never give your Social Security number for identification.
- Be prepared by being organized and keep paper bank records for at least one year to use as evidence if necessary. Often identity theft occurs inadvertently by certain companies' leaking of data.
- Order a free credit report from each credit reporting company once each year and carefully review the information it contains. To order your report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com.
- Hang up on telemarketers and never give personal information such as your birth date to the caller. You may register through the FTC at www.donotcall.gov or phone 1-888-382-1222 to keep them from calling.

Christmas Joy Offering



What is the Christmas Joy Offering?

For more than 70 years, Presbyterians have given generously at Christmas to support the unmet needs of families who have devoted their lives to the mission of the PC (USA). Today this Offering is shared equally by the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions, which provides critical assistance to Presbyterian Church workers and their families, and Presbyterian-affiliated racial ethnic schools and colleges, which enable students to develop their gifts and find their calling. The Offering dates back to

the 1930s, when the former Presbyterian Church in the United States began an offering to supplement inadequate retirement income and provide supplemental medical insurance for former ministers, missionaries, church workers, and their families.

Although its roots trace back many years, this special offering remains just as essential today. Equally important to the financial help provided is the spiritual benefit received. Again and again, the individuals and families helped by the Offering say that as crucial as the financial assistance is, what really sustains them is the knowledge that the church is standing with them in their time of need.

December is the time when we collect this very special offering. You can give at church, on the website, or by your cell phone. There will also be special stories of individuals who have been helped by this offering in weekly bulletin.



A Stewardship Minute

There is a compelling sentence in an article found in the December issue of Stewardship:

"Let us not be ashamed to have the Lord look not only at our gifts, but also into our hearts."

Christmas, of course, is all about giving. Christians understand that the first Christmas giver was God. As the Gospel of John puts it, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

Recap of things you can SEE and DO on gspcsq.org

As we've been telling you, there have been many changes to our website, <u>gspcsg.org</u>, over the past few months. With all of the changes, this is probably a good time to review the many things you can see and do on our site.

The most important feature of the site is the weekly and monthly calendars. The weekly calendar is posted each Thursday for the following week and the monthly calendar is generally posted the middle of the preceding month. Check here for all of the activities of the church.

News items of interest to the congregation are posted on the News page. Items are added as they come up.

You can support the church through the website by making your pledge to either the General Fund or the Building Fund online. Just click on the Giving tab at the left then on Pledge Support. On the Pledge Support page, you'll find forms for each fund that you can fill out and submit directly to Carolynn Thomas, our Financial Secretary. If you wish, you can also schedule payments for your pledge online by going to the Giving tab and clicking on the Online Giving button.

You can sign up for church activities online. You can sign up for things like the Christmas Dinner, providing flowers for the Sanctuary and providing after worship fellowship. It's as easy as filling out a short form and clicking "Submit".

You can listen to our weekly service online by clicking on the Listen to Services page or going to our Sermon Network channel at sermon.net/gspcsg. While, occasionally, technical difficulties prevent our uploading the service, it is usually available by mid-afternoon each Sunday. You can also download a PDF version of the bulletin from the service on the same page if you want to follow along.
