## Pastor Transition Roadmap for 2026

We have now begun the formal process required by PC(USA) to call a new pastor.

Through the spring, Pastor Celeste will lead a pair of Mission Study meetings on the last Sunday and the Wednesday following the last Sunday of each month. Each month the focus will be on a different aspect of Good Shepherd, its congregation friends and its place in our community. It is really important that as many of people who are involved with the church participate in these meetings so we get a good sense of who we are and where we want to go.

We began the Mission Study on January 25<sup>th</sup> when Pastor Celeste talked a bit about the process to come and presented a timeline of the church's history and asked us to add notes, memories and events.

The February mission study meetings were focused on Good Shepherd's identity, concerns and hopes for the future.

There will additional meetings in March and May. In April, Pastor Celeste will be out of town so no meetings will be held.

Once the Mission Study meetings are complete a committee will be appointed by Session to write the formal Mission Study Report which will include the information gathered during the meetings as well as information about St. George and the environment in which the church operates.

Once Session approves the report, probably in August, it will be presented to the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) for their approval and permission to form a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). We expect to be able to form the PNC in September.

The PNC will then begin the process, with the help of COM liaison Jane McCoy of Community Presbyterian Church in Cedar City, of creating and obtaining COM approval of the Ministry Discernment Profile which is used to advertise the position and begin the confidential process of receiving and reviewing candidates. The PNC will begin the process of identifying and interviewing candidates in January.

## Lent Continues

With our Ash Wednesday service on February 18<sup>th</sup>, Lent is well and truly underway and will continue until Palm Sunday, March 29<sup>th</sup>, which will mark the start of Holy Week.

We'll begin Holy Week with our annual Palm Sunday Breakfast at 8:30 am in Conklin Hall. Maundy Thursday is April 2<sup>nd</sup> when we will join Shepherd of the Hills for their "Living Last Supper." Plans are still being worked out, and we'll share the plan when it is finalized. The Good Friday service will be held in our Sanctuary on April 3<sup>rd</sup>. This will be an ecumenical service with Grace Episcopal Church, Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church and New Promise Lutheran Church taking part.

On Easter Sunday, April 5<sup>th</sup>, we'll celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and share fellowship with our annual Easter potluck brunch after worship. We'll provide the ham and ask you to bring a salad, side, or dessert to share.

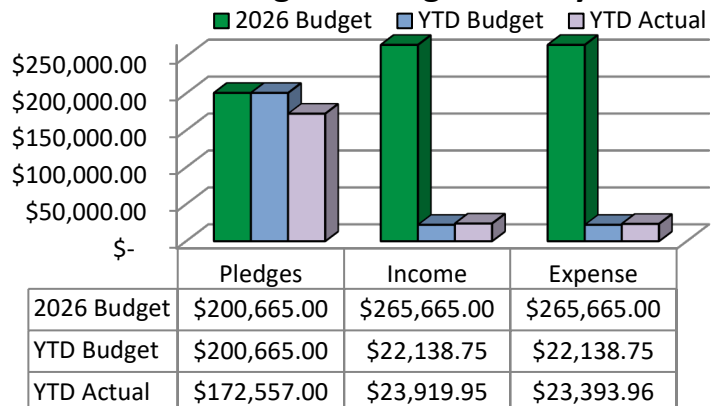

## Buildings and Grounds



Things are looking up at Good Shepherd (no pun intended)!

For several years we have considered buying a lift to allow us to get to places that can't be reached with a ladder. After several months of searching, we found a used Genie self-powered mast lift, also known as an Aerial Work Platform.

This lift will allow us to reach the church ceiling to do repairs and maintenance such as cleaning the chandeliers and replacing lights, painting and ceiling repairs, audio and visual servicing and updates just to name a few indoor uses. Outdoors the lift can be used for gutter repairs and replacements, outdoor lighting maintenance, tall tree trimming, and roof access. This piece of equipment will allow us to perform these tasks in a safe and cost-effective manner.

The cost of the lift was \$3500 used (about 25% of the cost of a new one) but it is in excellent condition. It will ship from Iowa at a cost of \$1000 and should arrive around the middle of March.

Finally, we'll have a way to replace those burned-out lights in the Sanctuary ceiling!

## Congregational Growth & Care

We found our Lunch and Learn event on February 4<sup>th</sup> with Guy Schultzman, “Energy Efficiency 101 and Our Church’s Journey to Net Zero,” to be very enlightening and educational. Because of Guy’s expertise as a Mechanical Engineer and the fact that he has been a part of all things HVAC at Good Shepherd, he was most qualified to speak about the topic. During his tutorial, we learned there are various types of thermostats and heat sources which may be employed to either heat or cool our air. Guy made use of various graphics and definitions to illustrate his talk. He also emphasized that proper maintenance of our HVAC equipment provides maximum efficiency in the conditioning of our environment.

Guy has long time involvement in the responsibilities of Good Shepherd’s Buildings and Grounds committee and thus was able to describe what was involved in creation of the systems which provide the efficiency we enjoy today. Our journey began in 2017 when a professional audit of our systems and equipment was commissioned. The committee and others then drew up an action plan aimed at making our church more efficient in heating and cooling our buildings. Creation of the solar electric system at the back of our property began in 2024 and we are already realizing financial benefits from its installation. The process to efficiency was documented in photos, some of which Guy shared with us. These photos, in addition to the slides from his presentation, may be found in a video of his program in the Health and Wellness section of our church website.

We are excited to announce that our Wednesday, April 15<sup>th</sup> Lunch and Learn speaker will be Washington County commissioner, Victor Iverson, the longest serving of the three current commissioners. He will be talking about our area’s growth, how government entities work together, and what our future may look like. It promises to be a most informative and important session, and we hope you’ll not only save the date and attend but also invite someone else you think would like to join us.
