Holy Week Activities

We began Holy Week with our annual Palm Sunday Breakfast on March 29th in Conklin Hall. It was well attended and everyone enjoyed the traditional breakfast of pancakes and meats.

Maundy Thursday is April 2nd when we will join Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church for their "Living Last Supper Cantata." This is the first year we have joined them, but from all accounts this is an evening that is both stirring and beautiful.

The Good Friday service will be held in our Sanctuary on April 3rd. This will be an ecumenical service with Grace Episcopal Church, Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church and New Promise Lutheran Church taking part.

Finally, on Easter Sunday, April 5th, we'll celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and share fellowship with our annual Easter potluck brunch after worship. We'll provide the ham and ask you to bring a salad, side, or dessert to share.

Holy Week is a time of reflection and joy, and we hope to see you at as many of these events as you can attend.

Mission Study Update

Each month through the spring, Pastor Celeste is leading a pair of Mission Study meetings on the last Sunday and the Wednesday following the last Sunday of each month. Each month the focus is on a different aspect of Good Shepherd, its congregation, assets, relationships and its place in our community. It is critical that as many of people who are involved with the church participate in these meetings, so we get a good sense of who we are and where we want to go as we seek a new pastor. The more input we have, the more the Pastor Nominating Committee will be able to match candidates to our needs and wants.

We began the Mission Study on January 25th when Pastor Celeste talked a bit about the process to come and presented a timeline of the church's history and asked us to add notes, memories and events.

The February mission study meetings were focused on Good Shepherd's identity, concerns and hopes for the future. These meetings were sparsely attended, which was concerning.

The March meetings focused our vision for Good Shepherd's future and the church's assets (physical, spiritual, financial and human). The Sunday meeting was held in Conklin Hall at the conclusion of Fellowship and was well attended. Together we identified a number of assets we can use to grow our church and our mission and got a better sense of who we are and where the Lord is leading us as we consider our future.

In the he final meetings on May 17th and 20th we will share what we have learned through the first three sets of meetings and look at the skills and characteristics that we believe are needed in our next pastor.

We need as many people as possible to participate to allow us to gather as much information as possible. Please plan to participate in the May meetings as they will help to guide the PNC in their work.

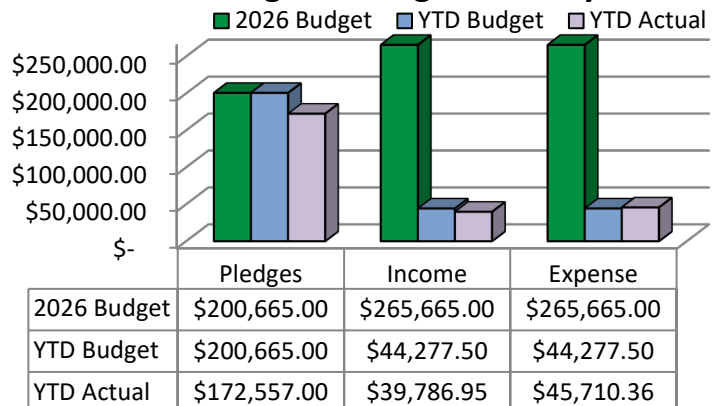

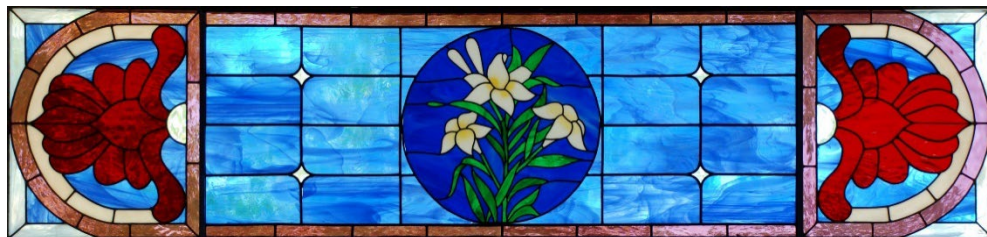

We are actively looking for ways to be present and support service organizations in our area.

My Rotary Club takes part in the monthly Utah Food Bank Mobile Pantry in Washington City and can always use more help. The pantry is at the Washington City Community Center, generally on the 4th Thursday each month. We gather at 7:30 am to prepare the food for distribution and distribute it to those who drive by to pick up their packages. We usually finish around 9:30 am. Deacon Sal Arredondo has been joining us for several months and Deacon Curt Whatley and Elder Chris Schleiter helped last month. It is a rewarding experience, and I hope you will consider joining us. The next pantry is on April 23rd. If you have questions, please talk with me.

We have had many questions about our annual Shoe Drive. Start cleaning out your closets - this year's drive will begin on April 19th and continue through June 7th. Again this year our collected shoes will go to Soles4Souls, a non-profit that works with like-valued partners to help people in low-income countries start and grow businesses - using donated shoes and clothing to create sustainable livelihoods.

- Motion to donate \$3,000 from the Navajo Mission Fund to the Navajo Bookmobile project in Chinle, AZ in two installments of \$1,500 each. The second installment is contingent on budget availability. The motion was approved.
- Motion to allow the Cello Society of Southern Utah to use our sanctuary for their concert on Sunday, May 3. Approval is contingent on insurance coverage. The motion was approved.
- OARS needs funding. Presbytery provides seed grants to build new worship communities. Motion was made to pursue a seed grant for OARS. Motion was approved.

It is easy and comfortable to spectate, but we are called to step out of that comfort zone and act.
