July is Per Capita Month

July is Per Capita Month at Good Shepherd.

Per capita is an amount of money (this year, \$55.07) that our congregation pays to the larger Presbyterian Church (USA) for each member. This money provides for administrative costs of our Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly.

Per capita functions as a shared covenant, allowing churches of all sizes to equally support the General Assembly, synods, and local presbyteries. Each level of the church receives a portion of the total per capita assessment. For 2026, the breakdown is:

Presbytery of Utah	\$40.81
Synod of the Rocky Mountains	3.00
General Assembly	11.26
Total	\$55.07

You may have noticed the blue envelopes in the pews, marked "Per Capita." Each year, we ask each member to contribute their per capita cost for the year. The 2026 per capita payment due from Good Shepherd is nearly \$11,000. By contributing your portion of per capita, you free up dollars in our regular budget for the work of our congregation in our community.

We thank each of you for your continued support of our mission.

Mission Study Report Writing Underway

With the Mission Study complete, the Mission Study Report writing team is working hard to complete the document in time for Session to approve it at its meeting on July 12th. Once Session approves the report including any edits Session suggests, it will be submitted to the Presbytery of Utah's Committee on Ministry (COM) for approval at their August meeting. Once approved by COM and they authorize the formation of a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), we can nominate and elect a PNC and begin the formal search for a new pastor.

The Mission Study Report is extremely important to the search for a new pastor. It is divided into sections:

- An introduction including a brief description of the church, the church's mission statement and a history of the church.
- An analysis of member and attendee characteristics, community demographics and characteristics and our congregation's beliefs and practices.
- The leadership of the church including Session members, Deacons, staff and significant volunteers with their responsibilities, the church's ministries and programs including worship practices, education, mission, fellowship, music and arts and facilities and finances.
- The church's vision for the future including characteristics desired in the next pastor, the church's strengths, challenges and our hopes and dreams.

Please pray for the Mission Study Report writing team as they work to create a report that accurately reflects Good Shepherd.

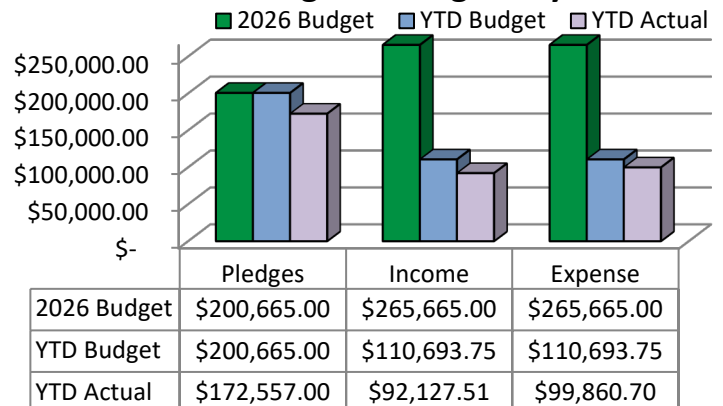

The Road to a New Called Pastor



If you've walked through the hallway between the Narthex and Conklin Hall, you've probably noticed that the Mission bulletin board is now a roadmap showing our progress toward the calling of a new permanent pastor for Good Shepherd.

As each milestone along the way is reached, the ATV will move along the road until we call a new pastor, hopefully sometime in 2027. The picture above will be updated as we reach each milestone so you can follow along.

The expected timeline is below, and the arrow will show you where we are currently:

✓ **January – May:** Mission Study process – small group meetings to gather input for the Mission Study Report (the 4th Sunday and Wed of each month except April).

→ **June – July:** Mission Study Report (MSR) writing team (appointed by the Session) prepares the report. It describes our church, qualities, capabilities and goals along with demographic information about the area.

August: The MSR is submitted to the Presbytery of Utah's Committee on Ministry (COM) after review and approval by Session, and once it is reviewed and approved by COM, the church will be authorized to form a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) through Good Shepherd's Nominating Committee.

September: The PNC is elected with 5-7 members representative of the congregation who have been involved in and support the Mission Study. Being "tech savvy" is also an important consideration as much of their work will be online.

October – December: The PNC creates the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) which is basically a "Job Posting." The MDP is approved by the Session and the COM.

January: The PNC **begins** the interview process with interested and matched candidates. This is open ended, depending on the number of candidates and special considerations such as family moves, etc. It should not and cannot be rushed.

We hope this information will help you to understand the process we must go through and where we are on the journey. If you have any questions, please talk with Pastor Celeste.

Congregational Growth & Care

Do you know what’s involved in providing fresh water for all of us in Washington County?

On Wednesday, June 3rd, Karry Rathje, Public Affairs Manager for the Washington County Water Conservancy District, a division of the State of Utah, came to Good Shepherd Church to tell us. Karry shared her extensive knowledge about how collaboration between Water Conservancy District managers, engineers and a Board of Trustees made up of the mayors of the cities in Washington County provides fresh, safe drinking water to eight cities and residents served by the organization not only for today but also for years to come. An extensive slide presentation helped illustrate her talking points.

Because we live in a fast growing-region prone to drought conditions and receiving only 8 inches of rain per year, the District must oversee being able to provide adequate water supplies not only to our permanent, resident population but also to our seasonal residents and annual ten million visitors. Our water is sourced from the Virgin River Watershed, a tributary of the Colorado River. To aid in maintaining present supplies, Washington County, with only 6% of the state’s population, can be proud that its local initiatives have resulted in our leading the state in per capita reduction of water usage. Planning for development of sources to supply future needs is key and dependent on being able to add about 40,000 acre feet of water to serve 70,000 homes at a cost of \$2 billion. In addition to those with private wells and water rights permits, five reservoirs currently supply water for culinary and secondary water use in the greater county area. Future planning centers on finding ways to recapture water, both potable and non-potable, purifying it for reuse and making it available to the public. The District is proactively involved in implementing ways to meet its goals by creating new reservoirs, building purification facilities and planning for infrastructure to convey sufficient potable water to county residents, businesses and public service facilities for the immediate future and beyond.
