Changes Are Coming

One of the concerns that was raised during the Mission Study was communications.

Over the summer, Session voted to move to a new Church Management System (ChMS) from Tithely. The system, in addition to improving the way we manage the church, includes a website, a church app, a new giving platform and greatly improved communication capabilities.

Session also hired Aubrey Amsden as our new Admin Assistant and her major emphasis has been designing the new website. It will be much more welcoming both for us and for those who might be looking for a church in our area. She has been working hard with major help from Pastor Celeste and Elder Ray Snipes, and the new website will be ready to debut on September 20th. Aubrey will be on hand during Fellowship after the Congregational Meeting to present the new website to everyone. There will be features added after the 20th, but the core of the new website will be ready for everyone to use.

The new giving platform will replace Vanco and will provide better integration to make tracking our donations much simpler. Because there still is a lot to do to move the information for this year's donations to the new system, we'll present the new giving system to you during Fellowship and the presentation from the Presbyterian Foundation on October 11th.

One of the benefits of Tithely is it allows us to have an online members and friends directory. The information in the directory is only available to those listed in the directory and will require a password for access. You will be able to see contact information for those in the directory and will also be able to update your information, if needed. A PDF version of the directory will also be available for those who prefer a printed directory.

Finally, Tithely provides an app for smart phones. The app will be available for both Android and Apple devices. One of the features of the app is the ability to create groups. Members of a group will be able to message each other, set up events and interact completely within the app. Anyone wishing to join the group can ask the group leader(s) for permission to join. This will spur group activity within our congregation from our Bible studies to the Knotty Knitters.

Bear with us as we roll out the new system. We expect it to take a few months before we get all the kinks worked out but we know it will be worth the investment as we seek to improve the operation of the church.

World Communion Offering

All of God's people gather around the Table to celebrate the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Part of the atonement that happens around this Table is reconciliation, which is the focus of the World Communion Offering. Experience the grace that comes from reconciling all people from all nations around the corner and around the globe through the ministry of this offering. Envelopes for this offering will be available the last two weeks of September.

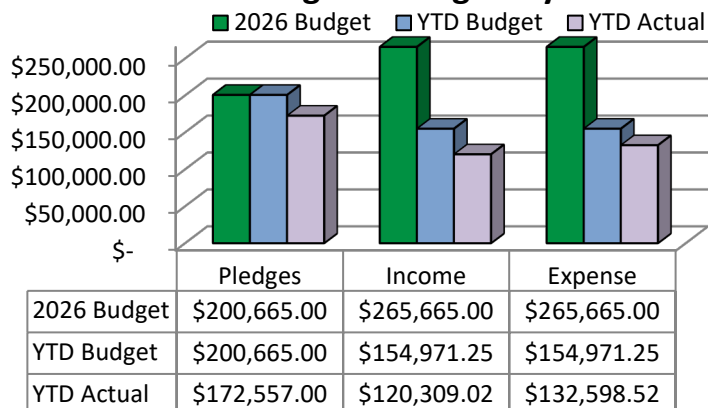

On the Journey ... with Pastor Celeste

Check out the **Road to a New Called Pastor** bulletin board. The car has moved! The journey continues on track. We're together on this road.

The Presbytery of Utah Committee on Ministry approved the Mission Study Report and authorized Good Shepherd to form the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). The church Nominating Committee is working on a slate of 5 to 7 PNC members who are active in the life of the congregation, tech savvy and committed to working together through this time-indeterminate confidential process. It will be hard and holy work. Pray for the Nominating Committee and wisdom and discernment for those being considered.

The PNC slate will be presented for election at a called congregational meeting Sunday September 20th, immediately following worship. Once the PNC is elected, they will begin orientation with Elder Jane McCoy and the Presbytery of Utah.

Through the Fall, the PNC will create a job description and job posting called a Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP). That will be approved by the Committee on Ministry and uploaded to an online matching system called Church Leadership Connection (CLC). Through the CLC, the PNC will receive matches of prospective candidates whose skills and preferences align with Good Shepherd. Candidates may also self-refer.

After prayerful review, the PNC will invite prospective candidates to virtual conversations. This part will take time and many conversations, with candidates and folks who know and have worked with them. This is a big decision on both sides, with many factors to consider and not one to rush.

The candidate and, potentially, their family will likely be invited to confidentially visit St. George and explore all it has to offer while meeting further with the PNC. It's important to remember that the PNC cannot talk about the work they are doing - even to spouses and friends.

Once the PNC has found the right candidate, the congregation will have an opportunity to meet and welcome that person. They will lead worship and share how they feel called to shepherd this congregation. In the PC(USA) the congregation votes to call their pastor, so an election will follow worship.

Blessings as we continue as pilgrims on this journey.

The Road to a New Called Pastor



If you've walked through the hallway between the Narthex and Conklin Hall, you've probably noticed that the Mission bulletin board is now a roadmap showing our progress toward the calling of a new permanent pastor for Good Shepherd.

As each milestone along the way is reached, the ATV will move along the road until we call a new pastor, hopefully sometime in 2027. The picture above will be updated as we reach each milestone so you can follow along.

The expected timeline is below, and the arrow will show you where we are currently:

✓**January – May:** Mission Study process – small group meetings to gather input for the Mission Study Report (the 4th Sunday and Wed of each month except April).

✓**June – July:** Mission Study Report (MSR) writing team (appointed by the Session) prepares the report. It describes our church, qualities, capabilities and goals along with demographic information about the area.

✓**August:** The MSR is submitted to the Presbytery of Utah's Committee on Ministry (COM) after review and approval by Session, and once it is reviewed and approved by COM, the church will be authorized to form a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) through Good Shepherd's Nominating Committee.

→**September:** The PNC is elected with 5-7 members representative of the congregation who have been involved in and support the Mission Study. Being "tech savvy" is also an important consideration as much of their work will be online.

October – December: The PNC creates the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) which is basically a "Job Posting." The MDP is approved by the COM.

January: The PNC **begins** the interview process with interested and matched candidates. This is open ended, depending on the number of candidates and special considerations such as family moves, etc. It should not and cannot be rushed.

We hope this information will help you to understand the process we must go through and where we are on the journey. If you have any questions, please talk with Pastor Celeste.

Buildings & Grounds

Session held their monthly meeting on July 12, 2026. The following actions were taken by Session at the meeting:

- Approved a motion that the current Congregational Growth and Care committee be disbanded and a new session committee created and tentatively named Vitality and Communication. Responsibilities which will include the maintenance and utilization of new systems of communication and encouraging and promoting Church vitality and engagement among members and friends and organizing assimilation.
- Approved a motion that the present session committee called Fellowship, moderated by Mary Contreras, be renamed as Congregation Life. Responsibilities currently will include sponsoring social celebrations, nurturing of the congregation, overseeing interest-centered groups (book club and parish wellness, e.g.). Congregation Life will also be responsible for receiving requests, scheduling and communications for all fellowship and congregational activities, except those that are currently in the purview of the Deacons.
- Approved the Mission Study contingent upon additions and minor edits. The writing team has received those recommendations and will revise the Mission Study Report. The revisions will be sent to Session for final approval by E-vote.
- Approved a motion to accept paintings by Luisa Estlack as gifts to the church contingent upon their size.

The next meeting of the Session will be Sunday, September 13, 2026, at 12:00 Noon in the CE Building.
