Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought



A number of current scholars refer to Paul's letter to the Philippians as a love letter, in that it reflects a pastor's love for his congregation in response to the love this congregation has exhibited so brightly, not only for its pastor, but for all.

With this interpretation in mind I find it to be a very appropriate text with which to end a year and to begin a new one. For in reviewing the year behind, with an eye to the future, I continue to marvel and appreciate our congregation's abundant love, not only for myself, but especially for our Lord, for one another, and for the sojourners of our community and world.

While our nation and community have continued to experience the tumult of our times and the uncertainty of the future, amazingly and boldly our congregation has lived a faith of joy and welcome continues to do so.

This is no easy task to accomplish in light of the recent and horrendous events that caused us all to mourn that have transpired in Newtown, Connecticut. It is difficult, sometimes, to rejoice "in all circumstances".

Yet Paul writes these words from a prison house in Rome, knowing that the end of his life is very near. Paul has much more reason to despair than to rejoice or give thanks, yet his last words to the Philippians', and to us, are exactly these.

If we look closely at Paul's words we sense Paul's answer, "be anxious for nothing, but everything in prayer..." In other words keep close to our Lord, lean upon Him in all circumstances and we will discover a peace that goes further and deeper than anything we have ever known before, a peace that lasts a life time and eternity. Cause enough to keep rejoicing and giving thanks, especially as we end an old year and begin a new one!

A Stewardship Minute

"Stewardship is how we manage what God has given us in this life." We are each meant to consider whatever we have as gifts from God and to be good managers of those gifts. We each have bodies, brains and talents and time to use all of those gifts to glorify God. Good stewardship involves good management of the totality of God's gifts to us.

An elderly pastor tells the story of a parishioner in a church he was serving. The man took giving and serving the Lord seriously. If anyone asked him why he was so dedicated to using his talents, time, and money for the Lord's work, he would smile and answer by saying: "The Lord has allowed me to have time, talent, energy, and a good income. If I don't use my assets in the right way, God may stick out his foot and trip me. Then I might lose it all."

He meant his answer to be funny, of course. But it does show that the fellow knew where his time, talent, and financial resources ultimately came from. They came from our loving Creator whose blessings are showered daily upon each of us.

Remember that Jesus said to his followers: "You are the light of the world." He continued by saying "Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5: 3-16) Should we not let our lights shine to glorify our loving Creator?

Prayer: Almighty and loving God, every good gift we have has come from you. Keep us mindful of your care for us and your desire for us to use our minds, bodies, energy and resources to bring light and truth to this often suffering world. Through Christ our Lord, we pray. **Amen**
