Rev. Ralph Celebrates 30 Years as an Ordained Minister

On July 10, our own Rev. Ralph Clingan celebrated the 30th anniversary of his ordination. His Tuesday Bible Study "Angels" provided the refreshments for fellowship following worship on July 7 and serenaded Rev. Ralph with a song. Chris Schleter shared a couple of stories from members of his previous church in Maryland and everyone congratulated Ralph on his milestone anniversary.

Rev. Ralph graduated from Westminster College in New Wilmington, PA, with a B.A. in Religion in 1979. He completed work for his M. Div. in Theology at Colgate Rochester Divinity School in Rochester, NY, in 1983, and received his D. Min. from Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta in 1996.

Rev. Ralph was ordained at his home church in Canisteo, NY on July 10th, 1983, by his home presbytery, the Presbytery of Geneva, Geneva, NY. During his ministry he has served in four presbyteries; Genesee Valley, Geneva, National Capital and Utah.

He began his ministry at Livonia First Presbyterian Church in Livonia Center, NY, serving from 1983 to 1986. From Livonia, he moved to Sodus Presbyterian Church in Sodus, NY, from 1986 to 2000 then served as Associate Pastor of the Neelsville Presbyterian Church, Germantown, MD, from 2000 to 2005. In November of 2005, he was seeking a new church and Good Shepherd was seeking a new Pastor. We seemed to be a good fit and he was hired as the third full-time Pastor of our church and plans to retire from his current position.

At Neelsville, Rev. Ralph was assigned to the Stephen Ministry, where he oversaw 25 active Stephen Ministers and four Stephen Leaders. He also began a Parish Nursing Ministry. He brought both of those programs with him when he came to St. George.

We are thankful that God saw fit to bring us Rev. Ralph and look forward to many more years sharing God's Word and Ministry with him and our community.

Linden Builds Table for Chapel

With the completion of construction and the re-organization of the library, Rev. Ralph suggested that we might turn the library into a small chapel for private prayer and reflection.

When we began thinking about this project, we realized that we needed a very special piece of furniture – a table – to make the chapel a reality. As he nearly always does when woodworking is required, George Linden built a building a beautiful table that is now installed in the chapel.

We want to thank George for his using his skills for our church and for God and hope that each of you will have the inspiration to spend a few minutes in the chapel for a period of personal prayer and private reflection.

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15 year term.



Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

Thankful, thankfulness and thanks, whether he meant to or not, are three words that Paul uses that, in my opinion, nicely summarize the Christian life and faith. In Christ we are thankful for what God has done for us in the very gift of salvation through his Grace. This leads us to live lives that are in a constant state of thankfulness "in our hearts" or, in other words, gratitude to God. Lives that display the love of God in all we do for each other and the stranger/neighbor we encounter in His name out of gratitude. And thus we meet each new day and moment "giving thanks through Him to God the Father." Whether we realize it or not to do so means to live, spiritually speaking, in a constant state of prayer.

What a simple and wonderful formula for the Christian life our brother Paul has come to offer us!

However, if you'll pardon my momentary dose of cynicism, when I ponder to myself how many of us fail to follow this formula and instead follow a faith that lacks a sense of thanksgiving and thus an attitude or aspect of joy? How many of us instead are living lives where we know the words yet they not been allowed to enter our hearts or become a part of our daily lives and existence.

One of my favorite quotes from my office door comes from George MacDonald and reads, "It is the heart that is unsure of its God that is afraid to laugh in His presence."

You see, to come to know God and experience Him in our lives in the letting of Christ's love enter our hearts is to discover that our faith is not nearly as demanding as we may have misled ourselves to believe, as it is joyful, and thankful. Just like Paul declares to us, and to the Colossians.

I wonder if the Colossians got it? And ourselves.

Mission/Outreach

Our quiet summer was punctuated from July 17-19 with the arrival of Bike & Build. Each year, Bike & Build organizes cross-country bicycle trips which benefit affordable housing groups. Specifically, they fund projects planned and executed by young adults. Over the past 10 seasons they have donated more than \$4M; built for more than 120,000 hours; pedaled over 6M miles; and engaged more than 1750 young adults in spreading the word about the affordable housing crisis in America.

We provided housing for the bikers/builders on the nights of July 17th and 18th and meals for them from dinner on the 17th, which was provided by Red Robin in Washington, through breakfast on the 19th. The bikers had been in Zion on the 16th and, after they left us, they continued to Overton, NV and will finish in Modesto, CA, on August 1.

Our congregation held a potluck dinner in their honor on the 18th and the evening was well attended and enjoyed both by the bikers and by our congregation and community.

One other item of note is that our sister congregation in Dorogobuzh, Russia, has invited a small group of us to visit them in August, 2014, to participate in their annual Vacation Bible School. We are in the early planning stages for this trip, which will involve about six members of our church. We continue to pray for our brothers and sisters in Russia and look forward to meeting them next year.

May God's blessings continue to shine upon each and every one of us.

Wendy's Window

It is my privilege to be writing to you from the lovely garden of the Columba Hotel on the Isle of Iona in Scotland where I am volunteering with the Iona Community until September 4, 2013. It is about 80 degrees, the sun is shining, a gentle breeze is blowing, the birds are chirping, the sea is calm against a backdrop of lovely mountains across the bay on the Isle of Mull and the sheep and cows are happily grazing. How grateful I am for a God who gives us time to rest and rejuvenate!

The Iona Community is an ecumenical Christian community that is committed to seeking new ways of living the Gospel in today's world. It was founded in 1938 by the Rev, George MacLeod, when he was a parish minister in Glasgow, Scotland. Initially, its purpose was expressed through the rebuilding of the monastic quarters of the medieval abbey on Iona and pursued in mission and ministry throughout Scotland and beyond. The Community remains committed to rebuilding the common life through working for social and political change as well as striving for the renewal of the church with an ecumenical emphasis and exploring new, more inclusive approaches to worship.

At the Community's three residential centers – the Abbey and the MacLeod Centers on Iona and Camas Outdoor Center on the Ross of Mull – guests are welcomed during a season that runs from March to October and over Christmas. The centers are run by a resident group of about 25 people, assisted by around 30 volunteers from all over the world. Hospitality is provided for over a 100 guests a week along with a unique opportunity to extend horizons and forge new relationships by sharing in the common life of worship, work, discussion and relaxation. Worship services are conducted daily at 9:00 am and 9:00 pm in the Iona Abbey with emphasis on the following priorities:

- The promotion of justice and peace
- The exploration of human sexuality
- Commitment to strengthening understanding between church traditions and to the sharing of communion
- Concern for young people
- The promotion of inter-faith dialogue
- The rediscovery of an approach to spirituality appropriate to our times
- The development of the ministry of healing

One of the Affirmations recited by all at the Iona Abbey each morning is as follows:

- Leader: With the whole church
- All: WE AFFIRM THAT WE ARE MADE IN GOD'S IMAGE BEFRIENDED BY CHRIST, EMPOWERED BY THE SPIRIT.
- Leader: With people everywhere

All: WE AFFIRM GOD'S GOODNESS AT THE HEART OF HUMANITY, PLANTED MORE DEEPLY THAN ALL THAT IS WRONG. Leader: With all creation

AII: WE CELEBRATE THE MIRACLE AND WONDER OF LIFE; THE UNFOLDING PURPOSES OF GOD, FOREVER AT WORK IN OURSELVES AND THE WORLD.
