As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15 year term.

Through the end of August, we had received pledges totaling \$65,456.00 and cash donations of \$19,449.45 towards retiring the mortgage. We hope to maintain the tradition of paying off our mortgages early.

Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

As the summer draws to a conclusion and we begin to focus our thoughts and energies on the coming Fall celebrations and activities I thought I would use the opportunity of the slow summer schedule to answer a few questions that I am asked with some regularity.

1. Pastor, when in worship we say together the Apostles Creed we use the word "catholic". Do Presbyterians consider themselves to be Roman Catholics?

No, the word catholic in the creed you might notice is in the lower case and means "universal". Presbyterians believe that on the great tree of Christianity we are merely a branch and not the tree. The tree consisting of all the branches represents the "universal" and worldwide Christian Church Universal to which we belong.

2. Pastor, at the end of the service you do the "charge and benediction", very often bowing your head, just what are you doing?

The "charge" is in essence your mission and you should listen to it thoughtfully. "Benediction" comes from the Latin "Bene Dictum" meaning "good words" or "blessing". With a blessing being a form of prayer, it is appropriate to bow one's head to receive it.

3. Pastor, there are so many translations of the Bible, which one is the best?

The one that best speaks to you, some people prefer the poetic language of the King James Bible and some like the easy readability of the Living Bible. However I prefer a version for study that is faithful in translating the original Hebrew and Greek of the earliest Bibles. At the moment, in my thinking, the New American Standard is the most accurate and readable. In worship we use the New Revised Standard which itself if a fine translation but is a little more readable and a little less accurate in its translation. As I said, use the one that best leads you to the Lord and nourishes your faith.

Hope this answered some of your questions, any more, just ask!

May the conclusion of the summer bring you rest, peace and contentment in the Lord!

Stewardship

A Stewardship Minute for September - "Bearing Fruit for Jesus"

We are excited to tell you that our stewardship theme for this year is **Bearing Fruit for Jesus!**: **His Grace and Power at Work within You**. This will start on <u>October 13, 2013</u>. The following is an introduction to what God's Word says about bearing fruit:

Jesus said, "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in me, and I in him, he bears much fruit; for apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:4-5). Fruit characterizes the life of the Christian steward. It is interesting to note that, in this passage above, Jesus did not say, "You should bear fruit." He stated that when we abide in him, it follows naturally that we will bear fruit.

Paul explained to the Galatians what that fruit is: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control." "Since we live by the Spirit," Paul exhorted, "let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other" (Galatians 5:25-26). As children of God, we have this fruit because his Spirit lives in us. We do not bear fruit as a result of our own efforts, but we do cease to bear fruit when we give in to our sinful natures, becoming, in Paul's words, "conceited, provoking and envying each other."

Just as fruit needs light for its growth and maturation, so do Christians need to have their lives illumined by Christ. They then are able to produce spiritual fruit and shed that light on the world around them. Ephesians 5:11 cautions us to, "Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness" but to "Live as children of light (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) and find out what pleases the Lord" (Ephesians 5:8-9).

We discover God's will through his word and through prayer. As Paul prayed for the Colossians, we, too, can ask God "to fill [us] with the knowledge of his will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding . . . in order that [we] may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work . . ." (Colossians 1:9-10).

God has plans and uses for our lives. When we abide in Christ, we will be fruitful. We will discover and follow his plan, and we will use the gifts he has given us in ministry to the people of the world.
