December - A Busy Month at Good Shepherd

As usual, December will be a VERY busy month. Beginning on December 3 with the kickoff of Rev. Ralph's Annual Tacky Tie Contest and culminating on Christmas Eve with the traditional worship service, there is something in December for everyone.

On December 4, Senior Ministries will kick off a new series of Soup and Fellowship Lunches. This lunch features a presentation by Carolynn Thomas on the Women of Faith Conference she attended.

Building Fund Update

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15 year term which means that if it goes for its full term (although we hope to continue our tradition of paying off our mortgages early), we will pay a total of \$241,831.80. We also need to replenish the \$45,000 that was in the fund when we began the project meaning we need to raise almost \$300,000.

Through the middle of November, we had received pledges totaling \$65,456.00 and cash donations of \$20,059.45 towards retiring the mortgage. That puts us about 29% of the way to the \$300,000 goal.

If you have pledged to the building fund, thank you. If you have not yet made a pledge, please prayerfully consider how you can help us to pay off the mortgage early and free funds to be used for additional improvements that we need to make.


Pastor's Page

"Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it Holy."

Exodus 20:8



"A Very Merry Commercialized Formerly Pagan Holiday!!"



Recently, standing at the cashiers counter at a local chain restaurant, I witnessed a couple berating the young cashier for her employer having only "Happy Holiday" gift cards and no "Merry Christmas" gift cards. They were almost yelling at the poor young lady who had no more say in regards to her employers gift card policy than I do, "We're Christian and want Christ in Christmas!!"

I felt badly for the young lady — if she wasn't feeling the warmth and witness of Christian love at that point I could hardly blame her!

However, following that scene, I was led to ponder a few questions surrounding the yearly celebration we affectionately refer to as Christmas.

To begin with what is wrong with referring to December 25th as a "Holiday"?

The word "Holiday" comes to us from the old English and originally meant "Holy Day". Personally with all the commercialization that now fills all our senses from now until the big day I personally would like to see a little more "Holiness" surrounding the day.

I understand there are those who object just as strongly to the term "X-Mas in reference to the day associated with the birth of Christ, however perhaps we have forgotten that originally our "X" was the Greek letter Chi and for the early church was one of the universally accepted symbols for "Christ". Personally I would like to see a little more "Christ" associated with the day most commonly associated with gifts and love.

Perhaps then, before we accost any more teenage cashiers in the name of Christ, we should consider a few facts that are generally not known or considered.

To begin with December 25th was originally a pagan holiday and not a Christian one. A majority of scholars believe Christ was born in the spring, not in winter. However early in the life of the church, as Christianity grew, a Pope decided to take the holiday, make it a Christian one and tone down the party. While the pagans and populace were willing to give up the day they were completely reluctant to give up the party, much to the chagrin and complaining of the Pope.

Therefore a few thoughts to consider: it is perhaps time for us again to take back the December 25th event in our own lives – to again make the day Holy by centering our lives and day on the joyous gift we have been given in the gift of the Christ and, through his cross, the new life we all now have received and celebrate in Christian love, every day of the year.

A very blessed and Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to you all!

Brown Bag Lunch

At our Brown Bag Lunch on Wednesday, November 13, Mark Phillips of Alpha Hospice made a presentation on hospice care. Rev. Ralph works closely with this hospice program and began by pointing out that there are many misconceptions regarding hospice. Mark then explained how hospice works.

Anyone whose physician certifies that, in his or her best judgment, a patient could die within 6 months is eligible for Hospice care whether due to a stroke, diabetes, COPD or cancer, etc.

Hospice can take place at home, assisted living facility, nursing home or even in the hospital.

Services include medications, nursing/aide (help with daily living such as bathing, dressing, and meals), pain management, social services, spiritual care, diet and nutritional education and bereavement follow up. It includes 5 days of respite care (one time only).

Volunteers are also available. Many are pre-med students performing community service which is a requirement for admission to med school.

Your physician can stay in charge of your care or can hand it over to the Medical Director of Alpha who is Dr. Grace Paradela assisted by other physicians including Dr. Kent McDonald. Rev. Ralph is their spiritual adviser.

God Is Able

"Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus...Amen." Ephesians 3:20

We confess, "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ or come to him..." While it is impossible for us on our own to believe in Jesus or accomplish his will, God is able. God is able to give us faith (Romans 12:3) and God is able to "equip [us] with everything good for doing his will..." (Hebrews 13:21). God is able through the working of the Holy Spirit to transform and renew our minds so that we have faith to obey and to do God's will (Romans 12:2).

God is able to change us from the selfish people we are by nature into giving and generous people. In 2 Corinthians chapters 8 and 9, Paul wrote about the generosity of the Macedonian Christians and how God's grace was available to the people in Corinth to become cheerful and generous givers as well. "God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians

9:8). Just as God enabled the Macedonians and Corinthians to give generously, God is able to give us hearts that are eager to give.

We are God's clay vessels which he forms and shapes into the people he wants us to be. He sanctifies us, he equips us, he makes us grow, he gives us victory, he gives us resources, and he gives us his incredible power. God is faithful to us and will provide.
