

It is within the Book of Acts of the Apostles that we read about the Christian churches' very first steps in Europe in the person of the missionary apostle Paul. It must have been an exciting and daunting time for Paul as he was leaving his familiar world behind and entering a place and culture very different from his own.

With the Lenten season and Holy Week behind us now our chair of the Mission Committee Elder Chris Schleter and I can focus on our preparations to visit our sister congregation in Dorogobuzh, Russia. Chris and I have been taking online Russian lessons for a couple of months and we are now able to say hello, goodbye, please, thank you, and get directions to the bath room. All will come in handy I am sure.

This relationship was established through the Mission Office of the General Assembly for the purpose of creating closer ties between ourselves and our mission partners throughout the world. Our purpose in taking this journey is to begin to build those connections as the body of Christ here in Saint George with our brothers and sisters in Christ in Russia.

This particular congregation suffered severe persecution under Stalin and saw a number of its leaders taken away in the middle of the night never to be seen again. Yet others continued to lead this church knowing full well the same might happen to them. I hope to learn from our sister church what it is to love and serve the Lord in the face of such great adversity.

What they seek to learn from us we will come to discover when Pastor Sergei and his wife Nina visit us sometime in the future.

Indeed this journey like Paul's will be an adventure into the unknown and unfamiliar, exciting and daunting, yet I look greatly forward to seeing Christ alive and at work in our Russian family in Dorogobuzh.

### **Parish Nursing**

On Wednesday, March 11<sup>th</sup>, Teri Koenig, A Gerontologist and a certified health and wellness coach from the LiVe Well Center gave an excellent presentation on Longevity Strategies.

The prescriptions for longevity are:

- Exercise aerobic, balance, flexibility and strength training go for a walk and get active
- Nutrition Drink enough water, eat less salt, eat more legumes and leafy, dark green & orange vegetables, eat less fat and consume more fresh fruits. Emphasize whole grains, drink low fat milk and milk products, limit alcohol consumption and take a daily multi vitamin.
- Mental Vitality surprise your brain, learn a language, do puzzles and Sudoku and learn new skills on your computer
- Sleep Exercise no less than 3 hours before retiring, limit caffeine, nicotine and alcohol, establish a sleep routine, relax before retiring by stretching, a hot bath, etc, avoid drinking or eating before bed, make your sleep environment inviting and if you can't sleep, don't fight it listen to music or read a book

#### Parish Nursing, continued

- Stress Deep breathing, seek out a quiet place to escape tension, achieve balance and reduce multi-tasking, do not insist on perfection or total control, find reasons to laugh, get enough sleep (7.5-8 hours), simplify and get rid of chaos in your life, home work place, share your fears-don't isolate, and do visualization, meditation and prayer calms your mind
- Nurture your relationships Have a positive attitude, stop negative thoughts, count your blessings, forgive yourself and others and let go, and choose to be happy
- Connect with your community be involved in activities, pursue a second career
- Practice prevention get those regular check-ups and tests

#### The Fields Are Ripe

Easter is the most joyous, the most victorious, celebration of the church year. It is an opportune time for us as stewards to "Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples" (Psalm 96:3)! What deed can be more marvelous than the resurrection of our Lord from the dead? Yes, "Christ has indeed been raised

from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20), and we, too, shall be raised from the dead to live with him forever in Heaven.

As stewards of the Gospel, we have this good news to tell. Jesus reminded us of the urgency of the proclamation of his redemption. We read in John 4:35 that Jesus said, "Do you not say, 'Four months more and then the harvest?' I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest." There is a need for us to tell this message effectively, passionately, clearly, and with perseverance so that all may be led by God's grace to respond to Christ's gift of salvation.

Along with pronouncing this good news with our own lips, we have a responsibility to give. We respond to the needs of others by taking groceries to our food banks, by contributing funds to be used for helping families with various financial difficulties, by sending money to areas hit by natural disasters, such as floods and hurricanes. What greater need is there than to provide financial support for those who minister to the greatest need of all ... the spiritual needs of Jesus' lost sheep? Our giving should be done willingly, cheerfully, generously, even as God in Christ has given to us.

Jesus promised that, as we carry out his commission to "...make disciples of all nations ..." he will be with us "...to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:19, 20). Paul reminded us that "God is able to make all grace abound to [us], so that in all things at all times, having all that [we] need, [we] will abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8). Every day, the Holy Spirit provides opportunities for us as stewards to tell the good news and to give according to our abilities that the message of God's love in Christ may be spread throughout the world. Easter is our reason: Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

The Worship & Music Committee has been working hard on all the services coming during Holy Week, culminating in Easter (Resurrection) Sunday on April 5.

- Thursday, April 2, Maundy Thursday, 6 p.m. Come to this special service, which includes a simple meal of bread, fruit and cheese to commemorate Jesus's last Passover and the institution of Holy Communion ("Do this in remembrance of me"). Bring some sliced bread, cubed or sliced cheese, or fruit to share. We will also have hand washing (in place of foot washing). The choir will sing one anthem. This is a lovely intimate service of remembrance.
- Friday, April 3, 7:00 p.m. Interfaith service at Good Shepherd with New Promise Lutheran Church & Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church. The combined choirs will sing an anthem, which will no doubt be wonderful due to the many voices raised in praise.
- Sunday, April 5, 10:30 a.m. Resurrection Sunday service, with the chancel choir, a singing quartet, and trumpets by Suzanne Czarnecki & D.J. Barraclough. We will not serve Communion on Resurrection Sunday -Communion will be served on April 12<sup>th</sup>. A luncheon will follow the service.

Session has approved, for this year as a trial, a small change in the order of worship. For those months having a 5th Sunday (May, August and November in 2015), there will be no sermon, BUT all the lectionary texts for the week will be read and appropriate hymns will be sung while sitting. This is a trial only so let us know whether you like this change, and Session will decide whether to make it permanent.

Remember, Rev. Ralph will be on vacation from Monday April 6 through Sunday April 12!!

### **Building Fund Update**

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15 year term which means that if it goes for its full term (although we hope to continue our tradition of paying off our mortgages early), we will pay a total of \$241,831.80. We also need to replenish the \$45,000 that was in the fund when we began the project meaning we need to raise almost \$287,000.

Through March 22<sup>nd</sup>, we had received pledges totaling \$68,881 and cash donations of \$27,587 for a total of \$96,468 or about 33.6% of the way to the \$287,000 goal.

If you have pledged to the building fund, thank you. If you have not yet made a pledge, please prayerfully consider how you can help us to pay off the mortgage early and free funds to be used for additional improvements that we need to make.
