Greetings from Princeton, NJ where I have returned after spending the academic year in Kodaikanal International School (KIS) in Kodaikanal, Tamil Nadu, India. I am grateful for the International Field Education Program at Princeton Theological Seminary which offered me the opportunity for this very interesting and formative experience. My time in India was spent assisting the KIS

with worship each Sunday, preaching monthly, planning special assemblies and seasonal services (Advent, Lent, Holy Week & Pentecost), teaching Religious Education classes, engaging in weekly devotions in the residential dormitories and chaperoning student activities.



I worked directly with Raja Krishnamoorthy, an ordained Presbyterian minister and the Dean of Religious Life at KIS and John Hildebrant, an ordained Lutheran minister who taught Religious Education at KIS and had been working in India for the past 12 years. Both ministers were very encouraging and helpful to me as I developed an understanding of ministry in another culture. It truly was my privilege to spend time learning about the culture of South India; an experience I will never forget!

Back in Princeton, I will be completing a Greek course this summer and will embark on my senior year as a seminary student in September. My hope is to graduate with a Master's Degree in Divinity in May 2016.



Several years ago, while reading the latest addition of the periodical <u>Presbyterians Today</u>, I noticed an article pertaining to our church's mission agency sponsoring relationships between churches in the US and churches in Eastern Europe. I called this article to the attention of our then new chair of mission Elder Chris Schleter and encouraged him to investigate.

To make a long story short Chris did and we have entered into a sister/twining relationship with an Evangelical Russian Baptist Church in Dorogobuzh, Russia. We have shared pictures and information about each other and on July 17th Chris and I will take the next step in building this relationship by going in person to Dorogobuzh and meeting our brothers and sisters in Christ there.

It is an exciting venture; we will be in rural Russia staying with Russian families. One has to wonder who is more nervous about our meeting?!

It is our hope and prayer that this is merely the next step in a long and loving relationship between our congregations that demonstrates that the love of Christ and our being the body of Christ can cross all boundaries, even those of nation and language.

Building One Another

NOURISHMENT

One of the simple joys of spring for me happens as I enjoy watching the growth of the tadpoles in a pool of water in a nearby park.

When our son was around ten years old, we were bicycling near a construction site and noticed a large pool of water where some dirt had been excavated and there we found a billion tadpoles.

We rushed home, found an empty coffee can, and returned to scoop up fifty of them. We put them in a clean kitty litter pan with two inches of water and fed them fish food – what else would we feed them we wondered – and they swam happily around for two months.

We decided to bike back to the outdoor pool only to discover the tadpoles were gone but around the water's edge were a billion tiny frogs. Now we really wondered what do tadpoles eat?

Turns out they adore lettuce, preferably boiled for a few minutes or frozen to break down the cellular structure and before you know it, little frogs are hopping around.

The spiritual life is much the same. We can subsist on a variety of books and videos that do provide some substance yet our Lord already has provided the food our souls crave to have.

"Their delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law they meditate day and night. They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper" Psalm 1:2-3.

ALONGSIDE

Recently a friend helped me figure out how to navigate a complex situation I was facing. It reminded me of one of my favorite New Testament words, paraclete, which means, "one who is called alongside to help."

"Paraclete" describes the very character of God for ours is the "comes alongside to help God."

God the Father is our Paraclete – "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort [paraklaysis]" II Corinthians 1:3.*

Jesus the Son is our Paraclete - "But if any one does sin, we have an advocate [paraklaytos] with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" I John 2:1.

The Holy Spirit is our Paraclete – "And I will pray the Father, and he will give you another Counselor [paraklaytos, also helper] to be with you forever" John 14:16.

The whole Trinity is our Paraclete – Who loves to come alongside us – to help us.

In the same way, we are sent to be paracletes to the people positioned in our lives – sent to come alongside them to offer help, encouragement, and presence.

Thank God for the paracletes in your own life, the people who love you, guide you when the going is tough, who put steel into your backbone when you are afraid, who stand with you in the storm.

Checking on our Job as Stewards

A young boy walks into a small drug store and asks the druggist, "Could I use the telephone?" The druggist replies, "You certainly can," and shows him where the telephone is. The boy calls a grocery store and asks the man who answers the phone, "Is your grocery store looking for someone to stock the shelves?" The man says, "No, we already have a stock boy." The boy inquires, "If he isn't doing a good job, maybe you need to get someone who will do a better job." The man replies, "No, we are pleased with the work the boy is doing," so the boy hung up the telephone.

The druggist hears the conversation and says to the boy, "I'm sorry you didn't get the job." The boy says, "I don't need a job, because I am the stock boy. I was checking to see what they thought of my work."

What if we could call God to ask about the job we are doing as his stewards? If it were possible to call, what kind of response would you expect to hear? Building Fund Update

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15 year term which means that if it goes for its full term (although, with your help, we hope to pay it off early), we will pay a total of \$241,831.80. We also have a number of major maintenance items over the next several years totaling more than \$100,000 that need to be funded in addition to paying off the mortgage, meaning we need to raise \$342,000.

Through June 21st, we have received pledges totaling \$69,881 and additional cash donations of \$32,083 for a total of \$101,964 or about 29.8% of the way to the \$342,000 goal.

If you have pledged to the building fund, thank you. If you have not yet made a pledge, please prayerfully consider how you can help us to pay off the mortgage early and have sufficient funds to perform needed maintenance and make other improvements in the future.
