

Rejoice always; pray without ceasing; in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18



With our two services on Ash Wednesday, February 10, we will have, with a large body of the Christian faith, entered the liturgical season of Lent – a season that in the life of the protestant tradition concludes with the beginning of Holy Week on Palm Sunday.

The word Lent is based on an old Anglo-Saxon word for "lengthen", for as Lent begins in the darkness of winter, it concludes in the light of spring.

The season of Lent lasts forty days modeling after Jesus forty days in the wilderness as he dealt with temptation and prepared for His ministry that would lead to the cross and His resurrection.

By tradition the season of Lent is a time of repentance and spiritual self-examination, that hopefully spiritual renewal.

Now, by all means I am in favor of repentance, however I believe rejoicing, praying and giving thanks are powerful tools for spiritual renewal, as well, and should not be neglected in this season of spiritual growth as we remember what God has done for us in the gift of Christ.

While none of us deserves this gift or the grace we have received because of His sacrifice for us all, we all have been given this gift and the next forty days are days that we too can remember and, in all circumstances, rejoice, pray and give thanks.

We have ample opportunity in joining in worship, attending our weekly prayer service on Thursday evening, studying God's word and listening for His voice as he calls us to new life in His name.

Hopefully then with the conclusion of Lent we may find our hearts and lives enjoying the light of a new day.

Mission/Outreach

On February 7th we will again participate in the Souper Bowl of Caring. For this event, we ask you to bring donations of non-perishable food which will be donated to the Soup Kitchen. Any donated food that the Soup Kitchen cannot use will be passed on to the Utah Food Bank. This event will replace our usual Soup Kitchen Sunday in February.

Session has approved a committee to oversee the Russia mission. The Russia Mission Steering Committee will approve activities and expenditures for this mission and, generally, guide our activities related to Russia and our Sister Church in Dorogobuzh. I will be the moderator of the committee and will be joined by Treasurer Carolynn Thomas, Jan Dunham, Scott Florence and Amy Craig. Rev. Ralph will be an ex-officio member. We'll be meeting in early February to put some policies in place and begin planning for Rev. Ralph's trip to Russia in August.

As I announced last month, we're collecting empty pill bottles (please remove the labels and wash them out) to send to The Malawi Project for use in Africa. Please only bring the smaller pill bottles, not the large bulk bottles for vitamins you may get from Costco or Walmart. Pill bottles are in short supply in Africa so doctors have to dispense pills in whatever containers they can find. By supplying them with pill bottles, we provide a safe means for them to dispense needed medications to their patients and keep all of those bottles out of our landfill. Bring your bottles to church and put them in the box by the outside door in Conklin Hall.

About ten years ago I had a fundamental shift in my thinking: things (Money, computers, cars, TVs, paintbrushes, etc.) lost much of their importance. Matthew 6:19-21 says "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in and steal; for where your treasure is there your heart will be also."

While traveling in San Francisco I had a lot of things stolen. My guess is that a number of you have had things stolen or been ripped off. I have rarely been so angry and hurt. Many colorful metaphors went through my head (there were children present)! The safety of my family and friends was really the key issue and we should have said a "thank you" prayer. The theft almost ruined the vacation, in part because I believed those things where so important, but I was wrong. We made it through. Things are not inherently important or bad. These things are just tools, toys and money. It is when you or I give them a higher priority than we give God that it becomes an issue. What is the higher priority, me buying a new cast iron lawn dog or helping a friend in need? "Things" are not as important to me as they once were.

You or I can be laying up treasures in heaven. When we spend our time and money on the things of man, then our reward will be here on earth. If we spend our time and money on God our reward will be in heaven.

Something to Think About

C. S. Lewis wrote:

I remember once when I had been giving a talk to the R.A.F., an old, hard-bitten officer got up and said, 'I've no use for all that stuff. But, mind you, I'm a religious man too. I know there's a God. I've felt Him: out alone in the desert at night: the tremendous mystery. And that's just why I don't believe all your neat little dogmas and formulas about Him. To anyone who's met the real thing they all seem so petty and pedantic and unreal!'

Now in a sense I quite agreed with that man. I think he had probably had a real experience of God in the desert. And when he turned from that experience to the Christian creeds, I think he really was turning from something real to something less real. In the same way, if a man has once looked at the Atlantic from the beach, and then goes and looks at a map of the Atlantic, he also will be turning from something real to something less real: turning from real waves to a bit of coloured paper. But here comes the point. The map is admittedly only coloured paper, but there are two things you have to remember about it. In the first place, it is based on what hundreds and thousands of people have found out by sailing the real Atlantic. In that way it has behind it masses of experience just as real as the one you could have from the beach; only, while yours would be a single glimpse, the map fits all those different experiences together. In the second place, if you want to go anywhere, the map is absolutely necessary. As long as you are content with walks on the beach, your own glimpses are far more fun than looking at a map. But the map is going to be more use than walks on the beach if you want to get to America.

Building Fund Update

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15-year term which means that if it goes for its full term (although, with your help, we hope to pay it off early), we will pay a total of \$241,831.80. We also have a number of major maintenance items over the next several years, totaling more than \$100,000, that need to be funded in addition to paying off the mortgage, meaning we need to raise \$342,000.

Our first campaign produced \$101,226. Through January 17th we have received pledges towards our second campaign totaling \$41,845 and additional cash donations of \$14,661 for a total of **\$157,732** or about **46.1%** of the way to our **\$342,000 goal**.

If you have pledged to the building fund, thank you. If you have not yet made a pledge, please prayerfully consider how you can help us to pay off the mortgage early and have sufficient funds to perform needed maintenance and make other improvements in the future.
