

## **News from the Russia Mission**

As you know by now, the Building Committee has begun the process of renovating the rest rooms in our main building. This project has been needed for several years and we thank God that we have the resources to make our facility a more pleasant place to gather.

Last week, we received word from Pastor Sergei that their congregation has begun a similar project but, in their case, they will be installing water service in their church for the first time. They are beginning this week and hope to have the project completed in time for Bible Camp in August.

When Rev. Ralph and I visited Dorogobuzh last year, we were impressed with what the women of the church were able to do using only the few gallons of water that the men and boys of the church were able to bring from one of the town spigots to the church. They used this water for cooking and then for washing up after lunch. In addition, the church members had to go to the outhouses in the back yard. Imagine doing that on a winter day (or night) in Russia with the temperature hovering at or below zero!

While we take for granted things like running water and sewers, our sisters and brothers in Dorogobuzh have maintained their good nature and faith in our Lord despite hardships that we can scarcely relate to. We pray for the success of their project and for their ministries!

## \*\* Pastor's Note Regarding Hospital Visitation \*\*

Please keep in mind that with the federal laws that went into force a number of years ago, hospitals are no longer allowed to give out any information in regards to patients to visitors, including clergy. Unless a visitor requests a specific name, the hospital desk is not allowed to give out any information, including religious affiliation.

So, if you or a family member is hospitalized please alert the Pastor, your Deacon, or the church office. Otherwise, we will not be informed of your presence there and unable to assist or offer pastoral care.

## **Christian Education**

As everyone knows by now, Rev. Ralph will be on Sabbatical from June through August. This means there will be some changes in our usual scheduled church activities. # **Parish Nursing Ministry**

Could you have a problem with drug interactions?

Does your Primary Physician know all of the medications you are taking, not only from him or her, but other Doctors and especially over-the-counter medicines?

We have a wonderful free resource through LiVe Well Center to help you. Tamella Asquith is a Medical Librarian Community Health Information Specialist who will research all the medications both from your Doctors and over-the-counter to see if you have any potential interactions of which your doctor is not aware. All you have to do is either bring in a list of all of your medications or you can email her and she will do the research and send you a report by email or regular mail. She can be reached at 435-251-3785 or by email at tamilla,asquith@imail.org. You need to fill out a form and there are copies available on the Nursing Ministry bulletin board at church. You can also download the form from our website, gspcsg.org. Select Ministries, then Parish Nursing Ministry and click on the Medicine Interactions link on the right.

It is highly recommended that you keep an updated list of all the medications you take. You should keep a copy of the list with you at all times or in the glove box of your car or in your refrigerator in an empty medicine container.

If you have any expired medications that you no longer use, you can dispose of them at the St George Police Department where they have a box in which to place them.

We'll resume our Brown Bag Luncheons on September 14<sup>th</sup>, when Teri Koenig from the LiVe Well Center will share a fascinating presentation on Brain Fitness. Mark your calendars and we hope to see you then!

### **Session News**

Session held their regular monthly meeting on May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2016. Here is a synopsis of the actions:

- Approved the establishment of the Women's Guild as a formal part of the Good Shepherd Ministry.
- Approved the establishment of a Checking Account at State Bank of Southern Utah for Good Shepherd's Women's Guild.
- Voted to send a letter of thanks to Dick Higgins for his hard work in finding pulpit supply during Rev. Clingan's sabbatical leave.
- Approved to change the Sunday School time to 9:30 am during the months of June, July and August.
- Authorized the continuation of the installation of the Rest Room Renewal Project as planned to start on May 23, 2016. Additionally, the Building Committee is charged with making a long-term recommendation to Session for installation of a wheelchair accessible rest room, compliant with 2010 ADA requirements, somewhere in the Main Building.
- Approved the estimate from Noorda Building Envelope Contractors to install a brown coated metal cap on the horizontal surfaces of the gazebo (tops of the walls) for \$348.00, to be funded from the Memorial Garden maintenance fund (balance-\$298.02) and Memorial Fund (\$49.98).
- Approved Rev. Clingan's trip to Russia in August, 2016.
- Approved the expenditure of \$1,000 from the Russia Mission Fund to defray Rev. Clingan's expenses for the trip.
- Voted to authorize requesting additional voluntary donations from the congregation to help defray Rev. Clingan's expenses above \$1,000.
- Voted to cancel the August 2016 Stated Session Meeting.

## **Senior Ministries**

The Soup and Fellowship in May, presented by our own Gay Cunningham, was most informative and interesting. As the Chief Nursing Officer at our Intermountain Health Care hospital, Dixie Regional, she explained the upcoming changes in the hospital appearance and services with two new tower projects to begin construction soon. The hospital is bursting at the seams at present. Neuro Rehabilitation, Neuro Science and Mother and Baby services will be housed in one tower and the other will be the Cancer Center, all moving over from the old hospital. We will have one campus instead of the two separate locations as we have at present. Gay explained the new precision Genomics Center. We are a full partner with Stanford University, cooperating with research on cancer tumors from all over the world in the attempt to target mutations of each tumor precisely to design specific therapy giving more quality of life to the patient. Genomics will change diagnosis and treatment of cancer and likely medicine in the coming years. This is the new frontier, right here in St. George.

We have full service award winning stroke care and state of the art equipment for our neurosurgery unit, including spine and head surgery. Our doctors in this area are the finest. We are implementing new electronic medical records, which is wonderful if you go to any IHC facility and need treatment as your records are easily accessible by anyone on the system. Connect Care is also available for minor injuries or illnesses if one lives too far away or cannot get into the doctor. It allows the patient to consult with a health care professional using a video chat format. The Live Well Center is available for seniors who are 55 and older. We are fortunate to live so close to this full service medical facility. While, at present, parking is an issue at the hospital, a part of the new projects includes the construction of another large parking lot, which should alleviate some of the shortage. Thank you so much, Gay, for this excellent presentation.

**Card Party**: We will continue our card party during the summer too. The next one is June 8<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 pm in Conklin Hall.

**Book Club:** We will meet on Wednesday, June 29<sup>th,</sup> at 1:00 pm in Conklin Hall. If you like to read and discuss what you have read, join us. We will likely continue discussing <u>Incognito</u> by Eagleman. It is about the marvelous workings of the brain and its wonders and powers but it's not dry or boring neuroscience. This author can tell a story better than Uncle Remus. We will also be reviewing Russell Estlack's book, <u>Seven Cities of Gold</u>which is based on history during the 1500's. Our next book has not been chosen yet so join us and suggest a book.

# What's The Worry?

Jesus knows our nature. He knows we're prone to worry. Perhaps that's why he warned:

"Therefore, I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your Heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?" (Matthew 6:25-27)

In spite of these words of both admonition and assurance, Christians still tend to worry. Sometimes worry about the ability to provide for our families takes over our lives to such an extent that it guides our thoughts and actions. We put off giving to the Lord through our church – "temporarily," we say – until we feel secure in our financial situations. Life, as you know, seems to throw one crisis after another at us, and, often, that financial security never comes.

We have the same worry when it comes to serving. We complain that we just don't have time. We work long hours, and then we have commitments to our families. How can we go to meetings or make meals for a family whose mom is sick?

Later, we tell God and even ourselves. Later, when the college tuitions are paid and the kids are out of the house. Then we'll have time and money. But then, after all that hard work, don't I deserve to get away and take a nice, long cruise?

We reap what we sow, we read in 2 Corinthians 9:6. What are you sowing? Proverbs 11:18 reads,

"He who sows righteousness reaps a sure reward." Matthew 6:19-21 records Jesus' words, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on Earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in Heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where you treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Is it forgetfulness of God's promises or lack of faith that keeps us stuck in this pattern of giving all for our physical, temporal lives instead of storing up treasures in Heaven. Take God at his Word: give generously, serve without reward, take time to help others, and watch him satisfy your every need.

#### **Important Information for all Windows Users**

If you have not upgraded to Windows 10 and are still using Windows 7 or Windows 8.1, you have until July 29<sup>th</sup> to install the free upgrade. Beginning on July 30<sup>th</sup>, upgrades will cost \$119 for Windows 10 Home and \$199 for Windows 10 Pro. If you are running Windows 8, you will first need to upgrade to Windows 8.1 before installing Windows 10 (this upgrade is also free).

If you are running Windows XP or Windows Vista, you should probably think about a new computer as these machines are likely 7-10 years old and will not perform well with more modern software. At current prices, a new computer can be cost competitive with the upgrade. Also, Microsoft no longer provides security updates for Windows XP so you may be at greater risk for malware. If you do decide to upgrade rather than replace your old computer, you will need to purchase a copy of Windows 10. You will also have to perform a clean install and you will lose all of your settings, although your files can be transferred.

# **Building Fund Update**

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15-year term which means that if it goes for its full term (although, with your help, we hope to pay it off early), we will pay a total of \$241,831.80. We also have a number of major maintenance items over the next several years, totaling more than \$100,000, that need to be funded in addition to paying off the mortgage, meaning we need to raise \$342,000.

Our first campaign produced \$101,226. Through May 22<sup>nd</sup> we have received pledges towards our second campaign totaling \$43,227 and additional cash donations of \$17,633 for a total of \$162,086 or about 47.4% of the way to our \$342,000 goal.

If you have pledged to the building fund, thank you. If you have not yet made a pledge, please prayerfully consider how you can help us to pay off the mortgage early and have sufficient funds to perform needed maintenance and make other improvements in the future.
