

** Pastor's Note Regarding Hospital Visitation **



Mission/Outreach

Thanks to everyone who contributed to the canned food drive during Advent. The results were truly amazing. We collected nearly 450 pounds of food and supplies and \$385 to help feed those in need.

The final numbers are in on the CROP Hunger Walk and we, as a community, raised just over \$6,200 this year. Our congregation accounted for \$1,327 of that and, although we didn't lead this year, we finished second in donations. Thanks to everyone who walked and contributed!

We announced last month that we would be offering a Brown Bag Luncheon in January. Please note that the date has been changed to **Wednesday**, **February 22nd at Noon**. The program will be the same as publicized, viewing of the film, "Moonshot Through the Double Helix," which documents the HOPE genomic medicine can offer to cancer patients who may have been without hope. Genomic sequencing is being conducted in St. George at Intermountain Precision Genomics lab under the direction of Dr. Lincoln Nadauld and employs innovative technologies to study a cancer patient's DNA, searches for mutations causing the cancer and identifies drugs not previously known which target the mutations. The documentary is the creation of students from the Dixie State University Digital Film Program and was presented as part of this past summer's DOCUTAH series. Save the date- February 22nd. Come, bring neighbors and friends, and learn about this wonderfully exciting and groundbreaking medical history being created in our midst.

Spotlight on Mission

You know, there's an old saying, "God works in strange and wondrous ways" and my talking to you today is proof of that.

I grew up in a Presbyterian family in the Washington, DC, area and was a big-time Washington Senators fan. I used to go out in the back yard and pitch a baseball against the back wall of our garage . . . a lot. When I got to high school, even though I was far from an athlete, I decided to try out for the baseball team. I went through the first week of tryouts and was holding my own. Then, I got the flu and missed a week of school.

When I returned to school, I went to talk with the baseball coach who told me, "I don't see you being a player for us, but we need a manager – would you be interested in that?" He told me that I'd be in charge of the equipment and keeping score and helping him with maintaining the field. I told him that sounded interesting and took the job. I was a sophomore. (continued)

Spotlight on Mission, continued

I must have done a pretty good job because my junior year, I was asked to be the head manager of the football team and I accepted. Now I had two sports to manage.

At about that time, I was applying for admission to college and was accepted at North Carolina. I really wanted to continue my "career" so I wrote to the Athletic Director for Freshman sports (they really did have them in the early 70's) and asked about opportunities to be a manager for football. To my surprise, he told me they were looking for someone and, if I wanted the job, it was mine. I accepted immediately. My freshman year, there were four of us, two for offense and two for the defense. My sophomore year, we were down to three and I had responsibility for the defense. I also began doing computer scouting for the team. My junior year, I was the head manager and had 3 others working for me. I had also, by that point, received a varsity letter, which was only supposed to happen after a manager's senior year. At the end of my senior season, the head coach asked if I could delay my graduation by a semester so I could work another season. Since I had two more required courses, I split them and worked a fifth year, which was unheard of for a manager. I ended up a 4-year letterman.

After graduation, I decided to get a Master's degree and kept working with football doing scouting, shooting practice film and helping to manage the budget. When I finished grad school, I had a job waiting for me (I even filled out my own hiring documents).

I went on to work 14 more years at Carolina before a friend I had worked with while at Carolina hired me to work on the Atlanta Olympics in 1996. After Atlanta, a colleague I had worked with in Atlanta hired me to work in Sydney. After Sydney, another colleague from Atlanta hired me to work in Salt Lake City. While I was working in Salt Lake City, a colleague and I took a golf weekend in St. George and I decided that this was where I wanted to retire.

The Salt Lake job led to a consulting job with the Athens Games which led to my being hired by Swiss Timing to be the onsite project manager for Torino and Vancouver. That led to my retirement after 7 Olympic Games.

I bought a house here in 2005 and, after the Vancouver Games, I arrived back here in 2010 and joined Good Shepherd. You know, if I hadn't gotten sick back in 1971, I can be pretty sure that I wouldn't be standing here talking to you today.

God does, indeed, work in strange and wondrous ways and I thank Him every day for the many gifts he sees fit to bestow on me.

Building Fund Update

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15-year term which means that if it goes for its full term (although, with your help, we hope to pay it off early), we will pay a total of \$241,831.80. We also have a number of major maintenance items over the next several years, totaling more than \$100,000, that need to be funded in addition to paying off the mortgage, meaning we need to raise \$342,000.

Our first campaign produced \$101,226. Through November 20th we have received pledges towards our second campaign totaling \$45,357 and additional cash donations of \$23,201 for a total of \$169,784 or about 49.6% of our \$342,000 goal.

If you have pledged to the building fund, thank you. If you have not yet made a pledge, please prayerfully consider how you can help us to pay off the mortgage early and have sufficient funds to perform needed maintenance and make other improvements in the future.
