Third Building Fund Campaign to Kick Off

Time flies! Can you believe that it has been five years since we added the addition to the Fellowship Hall? It has been wonderful to have more comfortable seating for everyone for our Thanksgiving and Easter luncheons and have plenty of room for buffet tables. But while we are enjoying all the benefits of a larger hall and remodeled kitchen, we still are paying for the mortgage which made this possible. As our second building fund campaign ends in May, it is time for our third three-year Building Fund campaign. As of April, the balance on our 15-year mortgage is \$120,444.71 and our goal for the 2018-2020 campaign is \$136,000. This amount includes mortgage payments for the next 3 years and other necessary building updates and repairs. Below is the breakdown for our goal:

Due to the aging of our buildings and some long-deferred maintenance and improvements, our need for the next 3 years is \$61,000 more than what we needed for 2015-2017. We can all agree that it is time to paint and re-carpet the Sanctuary and, as our buildings age, equipment needs to be replaced. The CE Building was built in 1999 and has had no major maintenance done to it since. We know this is a big ask but we also know that God has always provided for our needs through the generosity of our congregation and friends.

In thinking about this campaign, we came across this scripture from Matthew 6:21 "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." We think we can all agree that Conklin Hall is the heart of our time together as a congregation. Let's all use some of our treasure to finish paying for the heart of our fellowship and taking care of our other building needs.

Pledge cards will be mailed and also are available in the Narthex and on page 11 of this newsletter. Pink building fund envelopes can be found in the pew holders as well as in the Narthex. If you would like a box of envelopes, LaVerna, our Financial Secretary, would be happy to get you a box.



While the Great Commission comes at the end of the Gospel of Matthew it is in reality the beginning of the church's story, its family history so to speak. And that family history is all about the sending, in other words Mission. In fact the word "commission" itself is three quarters "mission".

Unfortunately for reasons that go far beyond the scope of this article that vision and understanding of the life and purpose of the church has over time by many become distorted. Far too many have come to see the church as a building or a closed society that exists solely for its own existence. Personally I believe this view has contributed to many churches' decline.

From the beginning we have been about the sending and proclaiming. And this spring and summer for our congregation will indeed be a celebration of sending. Beginning in May, on behalf of the Presbytery of Utah, we will be ordaining our own Elder Wendy Christianson to the ministry and sending her to serve our Lord in Alaska. It will be the first ordination to the ministry in the history of our congregation!

In July we will be commissioning and sending our 2018 Russian Mission Team, Elders Gloria McGilloway and Chris Schleter to our sister and ministry partner church in Russia where they will help support the annual Bible Camp. In the interview for their approval Elder Gloria stated that she has resisted going on any mission trip her whole life but when this opportunity came forth something within her (aka The Holy Spirit) indicated loudly that she should go! Elder Chris echoed the desire to continue to build our unity in Christ with our Russian brothers and sisters.

In other words, mission.

I believe these are just a few examples of our faithfulness to our Lords direction that we should go! Let us keep Wendy, Chris, and Gloria in our prayers as they prepare to go, serve, and proclaim the love of Christ.

Annual Shoe Drive Kicks Off May 6th

Our annual shoe drive kicks off on May 6th and will end on Sunday, May 20th. As you do your spring cleaning, please gather up shoes that you no longer need or want, bring them to church and place them in the box in Conklin Hall. We'll send them off and they'll be re-sold at very low prices to those who need them. We'll also get \$0.50 a pair back to use in our Mission program.

As a reminder, we can only accept WEARABLE (no holes in the soles, or shoes that need cobbling or mending) PAIRS (either tie them together or place a rubber band around them) of men's, women's and kids shoes. We **CANNOT ACCEPT** ski boots, heavy winter boots, roller skates, rollerblades, ice skates, flip-flops/crocs, bedroom slippers or single shoes. Last year, we collected about 125 usable pairs of shoes (and received \$63 for our efforts). Let's beat that this spring!

Parish Nursing

"CAN YOU HEAR ME NOW????"

Do you have a hard time hearing friends during a telephone conversation or even during calls from your doctor's office? Do people talk too fast? If your answer to either of these questions is "yes" or "perhaps," do you know that there are two wonderful services available to assist you with better hearing on phone calls?

RELAY UTAH began in 1987 as a telephone service, which would allow people with hearing and speech difficulties make and receive telephone calls. Through the program, specialized equipment is loaned to qualifying residents at no cost. Devices offered may include amplified phones or captioned phones, which work with landlines but may require high-speed Internet and landline service. The loaned equipment, in the case of a captioned phone, features a screen, which prints your caller's conversation and even slows down fast talkers. Those enrolled in this program are responsible for any service charges billed to the mandatory landline but financial assistance is available to aid low-income participants.

For more information regarding RELAY UTAH, please call Peggy Thomson at (435) 652-2452 to determine if you qualify.

CAPTION CALL service is free because it is a federally funded program administered by the FCC as part of the Americans with Disabilities Act. In order to be qualified to receive benefits of the program, a person must be tested by an audiology professional to verify the presence of a hearing loss. Also, the participant will need to have both landline and Internet service. The CAPTION CALL system works by receiving a caller's voice over a standard phone line and sending the voice to a communications assistant, who converts it into text captions. These captions are then sent back to the display screen of the home phone. For information about CAPTION CALL, please contact Brad Blackner at (435) 652-2452.

If you or someone you know could benefit from receiving the services of either of these two programs, you will find informational brochures about both RELAY UTAH AND CAPTION CALL on the Parish Nursing Ministry bulletin board in the hallway between the Narthex and Conklin Hall. Learn how to make THE call, which will allow you to enjoy phone calls again!

Building Fund Update

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15-year term which means that if it goes for its full term (although, with your help, we hope to pay it off early), we will pay a total of \$241,831.80. We also have a number of major maintenance items over the next several years, totaling more than \$100,000, that need to be funded in addition to paying off the mortgage, meaning we need to raise \$342,000.

Our first campaign produced \$101,226. Through April 22nd we have received pledges towards our second campaign totaling **\$45,357** and additional cash donations of **\$42,644** for a total of **\$189,227** or about **55.3%** of our **\$342,000** goal.

Our third campaign kicks off this month. Please prayerfully consider making a pledge to help us pay off the mortgage early and have sufficient funds to perform needed maintenance and make other improvements in the future.
