Sanctuary & Narthex to Get New Carpet

Did you know that the carpet in the Narthex, Chapel, hallway and the back part of the Sanctuary is the original carpet that was installed in the church in 1991? After nearly 28 years it is time for an upgrade.

At their August meeting, Session approved an expenditure of nearly \$20,000 from the Building Fund for new carpet and vinyl tile for all of the main building except Conklin Hall.

We'll be installing a slightly darker carpet and luxury vinyl tile throughout the building. Over the years, the carpet between the front row of seats and the choir platforms in the Sanctuary has had numerous spills during communion and has had issues with candle wax drips during the Advent and Christmas seasons. To address these issues, tile will be installed in that areas. The new flooring will enhance the look and acoustics of the Sanctuary and make for a more inviting Narthex.

Work is scheduled to begin on September 4th and will take about two weeks. Of course, all of the furniture will have to be moved in order to clear the floor for the installation of the new flooring. We will move the chairs in the front part of the Sanctuary, as well as the piano and organ, on Labor Day Monday, September 3rd. Once the front of the Sanctuary is done, sometime during the middle of the week, we'll move everything to the front of the Sanctuary, so the back of the Sanctuary can be done. Then, on Saturday, we'll put everything back where it belongs for worship on Sunday. The Chapel, Narthex and hallway will be done during the week of September 10th.

We hope to keep disruptions to a minimum. During the project, we ask everyone who is not involved in the project to please avoid the work zone. The Bell Choir will practice in the CE Building on Tuesday, September 4th and the Chancel Choir will not practice on September 6th.

With all of the moving of furniture, we can use anyone who is able to help. If you would like to help, please get in touch with Scott Florence.





Russia Mission Network Conference

We are in the home stretch of preparing for the Russia Mission Network Conference which will be held at Good Shepherd from September 26th to the 28th.

The theme of this year's conference is "Twinning from the Russian Perspective." Rev. Michael Zdorow, Chaplain of the Moscow Protestant Chaplaincy, will be our keynote speaker and we will be joined by Stanislav and Irina Oleynik from Smolensk, about 50 miles from Dorogobuzh. Irina is the daughter of Victor Ignatenkov, Executive Presbyter for the Smolensk Region and is active in youth ministries. Stan and Ira will be talking about Victor's camp, the role of the PC(USA) in its construction and Victor's outreach programs in the region. In addition, the Interfaith Choir will be performing for the group on Thursday night and Bill and Carol Somplatsky-Jarman are putting together an optional afternoon at Zion with dinner in Springdale for Friday. It should be a fun and interesting weekend.

Its purpose is to strengthen the role of Utah officials in the execution of state and federal programs at the local level. One of the services offered under the AOG umbrella is the Agency on Aging (AAA), whose mission is to provide information about local programs and services, which offer a range of assistance for older adults and those who care for them. In February, Good Shepherd Church hosted a six-week workshop on Self-Management of Chronic Diseases conducted by the AAA RSVP (Retired and Senior Volunteer) Program. The Agency is committed to helping older adults age in place and learn more about managing their health at home. Offering workshops about various health and lifestyle issues assist them in this work. As part of our ongoing relationship with Five Counties AAA, Parish Nursing is excited to announce that our second scheduled event this Fall will be another workshop they will hold at our church beginning on October 3rd at 1:00 pm in the Christian Education building

Stewardship

The Treasurer's report from July 31st appears on page 2 and our Building Fund report is on page 11. We are doing quite well so far this year, but a lot of our income comes from contributors who make their entire year's donation in December or January.

We received two anonymous donations during the summer, totaling \$104,600. As has been the church's custom, Session allocated \$14,600 to Mission and voted to use the remaining \$90,000 to pay down the balance on the building loan. With this balloon payment, the loan will be completely paid off with the July, 2019, payment. By paying off the loan early, we will save almost \$9,250 in interest. While the loan will be paid off early, we still need to keep our Building Fund campaign alive as, over the next several years, we have more than \$50,000 in needed maintenance and upgrades to be completed. If you've already made a pledge to the Building Fund, thank you. If you haven't pledged, please prayerfully consider making a pledge.



Building Fund Update

As you all know, we have a mortgage payment of \$1,343.51 due each month. The mortgage has a principal of \$184,117 and a 15-year term which means that if it goes for its full term (although we expect to pay it off early), we will pay a total of \$241,831.80. We also have several major maintenance items over the next several years, totaling more than \$145,000, that need to be funded in addition to paying off the mortgage, meaning we need to raise a total of \$384,000.

Our first two campaigns produced \$195,063. Through August 26th we have received pledges towards our third campaign totaling **\$54,100** and additional cash donations of **\$4,778** for a total of **\$253,941** or about **66.1%** of our new **\$384,000** goal.

Thanks to everyone who has made a pledge to the third campaign. If you haven't pledged, please prayerfully consider making a pledge to help us pay off the mortgage early and have sufficient funds to cover maintenance and make other improvements in the next three years.
