PCUSA Announces New Hymnal

In the early days of the American colonies, Presbyterians left all music decisions up to individual congregations. This resulted in a variety of different Psalters and hymnals being used by the young congregations. Presbyterian governing bodies resisted all efforts to form an official hymnal committee until the PCUSA General Assembly finally granted approval in 1819. *Psalms and Hymns Adapted to the Public Worship* was printed in 1830 and became the first official American Presbyterian hymnal in 1831. Later Presbyterian hymnals were published in 1874, 1895, 1933, 1955 and 1972, and 1990 – *The Presbyterian Hymnal* – the hymnal we use today.

The 216th General Assembly (2004) authorized the production of a new hymnal. Members of the Presbyterian Committee on Congregational Song (PCOCS) were selected and met in fall of 2008 and spent three years reviewing over 10,000 submissions.

The result is a new hymnal, *Glory to God*, which will go into production in July 2012 and be shipped in the fall of 2013. The new hymnal will contain the following:

- Over 800 hymns, psalms, and spiritual songs, of which approximately 50% will be from the 1990 Presbyterian hymnal. The remaining pieces will come from former Presbyterian hymnals, other denominational songbooks, and individual authors and composers.
- A musical setting of almost every Sunday lectionary psalm.
- Music from six different continents covering all major historical and contemporary sacred genres, including approximately thirty-five African American/Gospel hymns ("Soon and Very Soon"; "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot," etc.)
- Worship aids and printed liturgies for Sunday services (including Baptism and the Lord's Supper) and services for daily prayer. Complete orders of service will include congregational responses, prayers, and creeds.

The Session has authorized funds to purchase new hymnals for our church. PCUSA is offering significant discounts and incentives for ordering the hymnals by the end of December and we will take advantage of these opportunities.

Members of the congregation have the opportunity to donate money to dedicate one or more sanctuary hymnals and, if they choose, order one or more personal hymnals that will be theirs to keep. The cost of each hymnal is \$15.00. There are two ways to donate or order a hymnal:

You may fill out the form on the last page of this newsletter and drop the form and your check in the offering plate on any Sunday.

You may go to our Website gspcsg.org, select the Giving page, select the Hymnal page, fill out the form then pay for your hymnal online

Please note that, although we will be ordering the hymnals in December, they will not be shipped until next fall. All orders for personal hymnals must be received by December 15, 2012.

We hope that you will help the church by purchasing the new hymnals for the sanctuary and that we will all enjoy glorifying God through this wonderful new work.

A number of years ago a friend and colleague found himself facing the unusual dilemma of having both the Republican and Democratic candidates for mayor as members of his congregation. In the face of a potentially volatile and divisive campaign, my friend and his congregation exhibited the "wisdom of Solomon" and produced enough campaign buttons that read, "This Year Vote Presbyterian."

Unless you have been visiting Mars we are all keenly aware that we are quickly approaching the end of another, at times contentious, political season. As a pastor of a congregation that comprises both Republicans and Democrats, and possibly (although I can neither confirm nor deny this) a few Ron Paul supporters, it has never been my practice to tell a congregation who to vote for, I do believe, however, it is my call and responsibility as your pastor to tell you how to vote.

The answer to that question is rather simple and concise. In following our Lord's directive, we vote as we live, loving our neighbor before ourselves. When we vote we are to do so in a manner that we believe will best serve and love our neighbor before ourselves.

Brown Bag Lunch September 19 - "How to Know When It Is Time To Stop Driving"

Captain Jay Randall gave an excellent presentation at our September Brown Bag Lunch. He said that it is a very difficult decision to give up driving as it means giving away your independence. He urged people to make the decision themselves. You need to put both your stubbornness and independence on the shelf to do a self-evaluation.

He said that safe drivers require the complex coordination of many different skills. The physical and mental changes that accompany aging can diminish the abilities of elderly drivers. These include:

- A slowdown to response time
- A loss of clarity in vision and hearing
- A loss of muscle strength and flexibility
- Drowsiness due to medication
- A reduction in the ability to focus or concentrate
- Lower tolerance for alcohol

Taken separately, none of these changes automatically means that elderly drivers should stop.

Captain Randall provided us with an excellent checklist on safe elderly driving which will be in the Narthex of the Sanctuary as well as on our church web site. Please take one and honestly make your own evaluation.

He also noted that there are many ways for older drivers to adjust so they are not a danger to themselves or others. Among them are:

- Avoid driving at night and, if possible at dawn or dusk
- Drive only to familiar locations
- Avoid driving to places far away from home
- Avoid Interstates and rush hour
- Leave plenty of time to get where they are going
- Don't drive alone

Utah has an Unsafe Driver Form (DI117) that you can use to report your concern for the safety of a loved one or friend. The form is available online on the Utah DMV website. Your doctor can also send a request to the DMV to revoke your driver's license if they feel you are unsafe to drive.

Dr. Lance Greer of Advanced Hearing and Balance will speak at the October Brown Bag on October 24th. He will discuss how you know if you need a hearing aid and what your options are as to kinds and what can you expect from a hearing aid.

Happy fall, Ladies! There are big changes going on all around us. The weather is cooler and, thankfully, drier. Fall allergy season is upon us. The Fellowship Hall is awaiting its new look.

PW is awaiting its new look, too. Over the years, we have held many luncheons, rummage sales and other activities. Using the funds from the rummage sales, we have been able to donate thousands of dollars to local missions. We support The Children's Learning Center, The Doctors' Volunteer Clinic, The Soup Kitchen, Backpacks for School Kids (with the Assistance League), The Dove Center, The Erin Kimball Foundation, and Dixie Care and Share, among others. We have watched our Compassion International child, Victorie in Rwanda, grow from childhood to a beautiful woman who is learning English in school and who hopes to have a career using her education. We have supported our youth and tithed our rummage proceeds to the church.

Every Christmas, we have collected paper goods for The Children's Justice Center and sent the money from our Christmas bake sale to KONY for Kids.

Our ongoing mission to the Marines in Afghanistan has sent hundreds of helmet liners and scarves to our troops. Our troops particularly appreciate the boxes of goodies. PW has funded some of the yarn and postage for this project while The Knotty Knitters did the handiwork.

Our once-a-month Bible Studies have followed a range of topics over the years. Our members have participated in presbytery activities and have gone to The Churchwide Gathering of Presbyterian Women.

We helped The Hope Organization to win a Thank Grant from Churchwide Presbyterian Women in 2008. The Hope Organization continues to help women children and families who have fled polygamy to adjust to life on the outside. It provides clothing, housing, educational opportunities, and life skills training to escapees.

Now, we need your help! Many of our board members have accepted other positions within the church. Most have held their positions for more than three years. It is time for a new group of women, with new ideas, to take over the reins. The jobs are easy and fun and we will be there to help you along the way. Our officers take up their positions in January and serve for one year.

We will hold our rummage sale in March. Thank you all for your contributions!

A Stewardship Minute

A story in ***Stewardship*** tells of people who wanted to build a bridge over a river. On one side of the river, they found bedrock that was not very deep. That meant the stanchion or pillar could easily be built there. On the other side, however, the bedrock was at a depth of 110 feet. Naturally, that was going to be a problem for them, yet they came up with a solution. They decided to make a long and large metal pipe that would be placed on the bedrock, then fill it with concrete. Thus, they had the two stanchions to serve as the foundations for the building of the bridge. The bridge ultimately was built and is there to cross this very day.

The writer makes the point that just as the bridge needed a good foundation, so too, as Christians we need to have a foundation on which we can build a life pleasing to God; a firm foundation to live as Christians. And that foundation is our Christ our Lord. Jesus, telling his listeners that if they called him Lord and followed his teachings, they would be like the man who built his house on a rock foundation. When a flood came, his house would not be washed away. Then our Lord said if a person did not build a house on a strong foundation, when a flood came, it would be washed away. And great would be the ruin of that house. This should prove to be an excellent experience and opportunity to visit the land of our Savior's birth, life, death, and resurrection during the time of year His birth is being celebrated. Reformation Sunday, October 28th

On October 28th we will celebrate Reformation Sunday with our annual Kirkin'O'th'Tartan Worship service. What does "Kirkin'O'Th'Tartan" mean? A loose translation would be "blessing of the tartans" or "blessing of the families". The Kirkin'O'th'Tartan service is an opportunity for all Christians to rededicate themselves to the God of their heritage, the Lord Jesus Christ, and renew their commitments to His service.

The Kirkin'O'th'Tartan service seems so ancient that many assume it was brought to America by our Scottish forefathers. However, the first Kirkin' service was probably held in Washington's New York Avenue Presbyterian Church on April 27, 1941. Its Minister was the late Peter Marshall, Chaplain of the U.S. Senate and the Washington St. Andrew's Society. Since that time Kirkin' ceremonies have been held throughout America. There is evidence that the American Kirkin' does have its roots in Scotland. It is said when the English conquerors banned the wearing of the Tartan in 1745, some Scottish clansmen began to carry swatches of the material into their church services, concealed under their clothing. At some point in the service, when the clergyman would give a blessing, the clansmen would touch their bits of Tartan, and with no outward signals, an underground Kirkin' occurred. The Clergy Tartan is the only Tartan that has no family or clan affiliation in the entire Scottish registry of Tartans.

This will be a special service with music provided by bag pipers who have played for us before. Also, if you have a Scottish clan in your pedigree, please let us know so we may recognize your clan during the service and don't forget to wear your tartan to church!
