November Kicks Off the Holidays

October was busy. November will be busier!

Our Stewardship campaign for 2025 will kick off on Sunday, November 3rd, following worship. During the Deacon's annual Soup Sunday, Rev. Ralph will speak on Christian Stewardship and Chris Schleter will present our 2025 budget with a "narrative" budget. The narrative budget takes the pages of numbers that make up the detailed budget and allocates each of those numbers to one of four broad categories that represent the ministries of the church: Worship and Music, Mission and Outreach, Pastoral Care and Education. During the luncheon, each table will have a leader who will facilitate discussion of the budget and where God is taking our church next year and beyond. Chris will circulate and be available to answer any questions about the detailed budget.

The annual CROP Hunger Walk will be November 9th. We will begin at 10:00 am Larkspur Park in Bloomington Hills. We hope that everyone will either walk with us or donate to one of our walkers. Good Shepherd has a history of making the largest donation to the CROP Walk of any organization in the area and we hope the tradition will continue.

The Interfaith Choir and the Crimson Cliffs High School Madrigals will hold a special concert, "Simple Gifts" on November 10th at 7:00 pm at the St. George Catholic Church.

On November 24th we'll celebrate our many gifts from God with our annual Thanksgiving potluck luncheon after worship. We'll supply the turkey and ask each of you to bring a side, salad or dessert to share.

We'll host the annual Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service with Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church, New Promise Lutheran Church and Grace Episcopal Church on November 26th at 7:00 pm in our Sanctuary.

Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes are still available. Pick up one or several shoeboxes, fill them with goodies for children in developing countries and bring them back on November 24th, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, when we'll dedicate our shoeboxes for 2025. The Knotty Knitters are nearly done packing 110 boxes this year to add to our totals. Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes introduce Christ to children who may never have received a gift before, and the children are offered an opportunity to know our Lord and learn more about Him.

There will be more, many more, potlucks and events during December so get out your cookbooks and find new things to share. More about December next month.

There won't be a dull moment in our church life, and we hope that everyone will participate in as many of these events as possible. There is no church without you!



Rev. Ralph's Food for Thought

"O May this bounteous God through all our life be near us, with ever joyful hearts and blessed peace to cheer us; and keep us in God's grace, and guide us when perplexed, and free us from all ills in this world and the next."

With our national election being the predominant focus of our attention we may just have missed that this month we will celebrate the national holiday of Thanksgiving. Supposedly a day set aside not only for football and turkey but as well to take time to thank God for the many blessings we have received from His love for us.

The above citation is verse 2 from the Thanksgiving Hymn, "Now Thank We All Our God".

The hymn is a table prayer put to music written by Pastor Martin Rinkart, a Protestant pastor in a German city during the 30 Years War, (1618-1648). During that time Pastor Rinkart saw plague, war and famine, to the point that well over half of his congregation perished. At one point Pastor Rinkart was doing over 50 funerals a day.

I can't imagine the grief and doubt that would have filled his heart and soul. Yet, clearly, his faith was only strengthened. With the conclusion of the war, Rinkart wrote a prayer for his family at table. We are given a window as to how he endured. His focus was on God. No matter what he faced, it was there he leaned for strength and peace.

At this writing the national election has not yet taken place. No matter the result perhaps now is the time to refocus our lives on the greater truth. That God is with us. Our Lord walks with us, yesterday, today and tomorrow. And for this we should give God our thanks and praise not just on November 28th, but every day.

"Who from our mothers arm, hath blessed us on our way with countless gifts of love, and still is ours today."

Mission/Outreach

The Mission Committee met in October to gather some ideas for new and continuing projects for 2025. One of the outcomes was a commitment to continue supporting Chinle Planting Hope, the group that is doing so much good work on the Navajo reservation. Along with our other Mission donations, we will be making a cash donation to them for use with their major projects: the bookmobile, providing solar electric systems to homes on the reservation and their food pantry. Bill and Carol Somplatsky-Jarman will also be working with them to find one or more hands-on projects we might be able to help with next year.

CROP Walk: Mark your calendars for the 15th Annual St. George Area CROP Walk to end hunger. The walk is November 9th at 10:00 am beginning and ending at Larkspur Park in Bloomington Hills. We'll have the mayors of St. George and Washington City as well as representatives of the Interfaith Council there to send us on our way. We're also expecting a large contingent from Utah Tech to walk with us this year.

Envelopes for walkers will be available through November 3rd so if you want to walk with us, please see me and I'll get you an envelope.

If you don't want to walk but want to support our walkers, we'll place the envelopes for all our walkers on a table in Conklin Hall during Fellowship on November 3rd and you can stuff them with money. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds from the walk will go to support Solomon's Porch.

Session News

Session held their monthly meeting on October 13, 2024. The following actions were taken:

- Approved to receive Tom Parkinson and Jamie Dinkler Parkinson into the membership of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church. They will be received by the congregation on October 20, 2024.
- Approved Study Leave to allow Rev. Ralph Clingan to attend the EEPN annual conference on 10-31 to 11-2-2024 and to allocate \$500 for expenditures to be paid from the Russian Mission Fund.
- Approved to present the 2025 Draft Budget to the congregation.
- Approved to amend and revise Policy PO-P-003 to Child, Youth, and Vulnerable Adult Protection. The previous policy was only Child and Youth Protection.

Other actions:

- 9-23-2024 E-Vote approved to authorize the lease of a Xerox Altalink C8255/ENGH2 copier per the lease terms provided.
- 9-23-2024 E-Vote approved to authorize an order to TDS for enhanced internet and phone services as proposed with the option to cancel the order should the proposed service not be available at our location.
- 10-9-2024 E-Vote approved the burial of the ashes of Janet Wise in the Memorial Rose Garden of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church.
- 10-18-2024 E-Vote approved the proposal of Holbrook Paving to seal cracks in the church parking lot at a cost of \$5,558.28 with funds to come from the Building Fund.

The next meeting of the Session will be Sunday, November 10, 2024, at 12:00 Noon in the CE Building.

Stewardship

It's fall and that means it's Stewardship season. We will kick off our campaign for next year on November 3rd with Rev. Ralph speaking to us about Christian Stewardship and Chris Schleter presenting our 2025 budget and programs for the year. We also will have a brief message during worship on Sundays in November.

You are probably already familiar with our financial challenges this year, and next year will be no different. We've controlled expenses in every way we can and, due to some of the groundwork we've laid in 2024, our budget for 2025 is expected to increase by just over \$1,000 despite rising insurance costs and general inflation. Given that we have not fully funded the 2024 budget, next year will continue to be challenging. We are asking everyone to prayerfully consider helping to support our church and our programs with this need in mind.
